**NEW ARRIVAL**

New to Torrance is the Southern California Quarter Midget Association, better known as "Little Indy." This organization is a group of 60 to 70 quarter midget drivers and their parents. Every Saturday night the children, ranging from 5 to 15, don helmet and goggles and head for competition at the track at 190th and Normandie.

Little Indy has six to eight heat races and five or six main event races. On special occasions the mothers climb into their sons' and daughters' cars and spin around the track.

The quarter midget car is a scaled down version of the big time cars. The quarter midget has a 2 1/2-horsepower engine capable of going 20 to 30 miles per hour.

Little Indy was formed about five years ago by a group of fathers whose children had been racing at various tracks in the southland. A track was built in Venice through the hard labor and cooperation of these fathers and their families. Equipment and material also were donated and obtained by members.

Three years later the track was moved to El Segundo to make room for the new Playa Del Ray Harbor and one year later moved to Torrance. The purpose of the organization is primarily fun and to teach the basics of good sportsmanship to the children.

The races are held on a 1-20 mile oval, which is maintained and operated by fathers of the drivers. Spectators are welcome free of charge.

Little Indy is only one of many such groups throughout the country. Estimates show approximately 1500 active groups in the United States. California has the greatest amount of participation.
