Voices Are Integrated

Blended human voices are simply one integrated musical 'instrument' in Bandleader Ray Conniff's scores.

Conniff is the first popular orchestra leader to write arrangements in which the chorus is scored as another instrument. Conniff isn't after words - just tonal phrasing in his own unique style. His chorus may sing gibber-ish like bo-bo-be-bo, if Conniff gets the effects he's after.

Conniff's chorus sets patterns and interweaves counterpoint in the unusual total effect created by a conniff

The Attleboro, Mass. bandleader is the first to employ a chorus as an instrument "inside" the band, instead of as a separate "outside" musi-

cal entity.
