Remember polio booster shots are still needed each year even after the three shot series. If more than a year has elapsed since these, the series should be repeated. Two follow-up clinics will be held June 30 and July 28 so that the three required shots may be had Tetanus shots will be available also.

SHADES OF COLOR

Bring a bright new view to your room by making window shades out of a gay, summery fabric.

Using your old shade as a pattern, measure length you want new shade to be, suggests the June Seventeen. Add one inch for a top hem, two inches for a bottom hem. Measure width and allow two and a half inches for side hems. Hand-stitch a one-inch hem on each side of shade and a half - inch top hem. Make a one and three-quarter inch bottom hem, leaving the ends open to insert the bottom slat. Staple top hem to your shade roller.
