

Small Business Leaflet Ready For Distribution

Donald McLarnan, Regional Director of the Small Business Administration for this area, announced this week that copies of a revised leaf-let explaining the broadened coverage of the Agency's limited loan participation plan are available on request at the local SBA office, located at 312 West Fifth Street, Los Angeles 13, California. The revised leaflet points out that SBA's share in one of these loans may now be as much as \$25,000 or 75 per cent of the total amount of the loan, whichever is the



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share in the loan. Maximum maturity of these loans is 5 years, with a monthly repayment schedule, including principal and interest. The maximum interest rate on SBA's share of these loans is 5½ per cent, except in areas classified by the U.S. Department of Labor as having a substantial labor surplus. In these distress areas, the SBA interest rate is 4 per
