Hollypark Schedules 21st Hollywood Derby July 8

Topped by the invading twosome of Sherlock and Guadalupe, the one-three horses of the \$148,650 Belmont Stakes, the third gem of the Triple Crown for three-year-olds, the \$100,000 added Hollywood Derby will have its twenty-first running and probably its most thrilling renewal in history at Hollywood Park on Saturday, July 8.

On hand, among other western stars to challenge the invaders is Four-and-Twenty, the Albera Ranches color-bearer who so easily outdistanced his field in the recent mile and one-eighth Cinema Handicap, a race that many times in the past has pointed out the winner of the mile and one-quarter Derby.

Five horses have parlayed the Cinema into a Derby conquest—the great filly Honey-moon in 1946, Yankee Valor in 1947, Pedigree in 1949, A Gleam in 1952 and the money-winning king of all time, Round Table, in 1957.

BELMONT WIN

Because of his six-length victory in the Blue Grass takes and the two and one-half length win he posted in the Belmont Stakes at one and one-half miles, Jacob Sherlock is the better known of the two eastern colts who flew to Hollywood Park from New York this week especially for the Hollywood Derby.

Sherlock is the son of Correspondent, the California-bred who won the 1954 \$162,100 Hollywood Gold Cup. After his galloping win in the Blue Grass, Sherlock was out of the money behind Carry Back in both the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, but he came into his own in the Belmont.

Gaudalcanal, a Citation colt owned by Mrs. Robert Dotter and trained by her husband, ex-jockey Bobby Dotter, has been raced lightly this year and appeared in none of the sophomore classics until the Belmont. Previously he had won an overnight race at a flat mile at Aqueduct.

Dotter believes that Gaudalcanal is the best colt ever sired by the mighty Citation. Also a one-time Hollywood Gold Cup winner, and that the ten-furlong distance of the Hollywood Derby will be exactly to his liking.

However, the prestige of the eastern invaders will not scare off the western three-year-olds and a large field is anticipated. The Cinema Handicap was split into two divisions because of the interest in the three-year-old championship race, and the majority of the 17 who started in the two divisions of the Cinema will try the Derby.

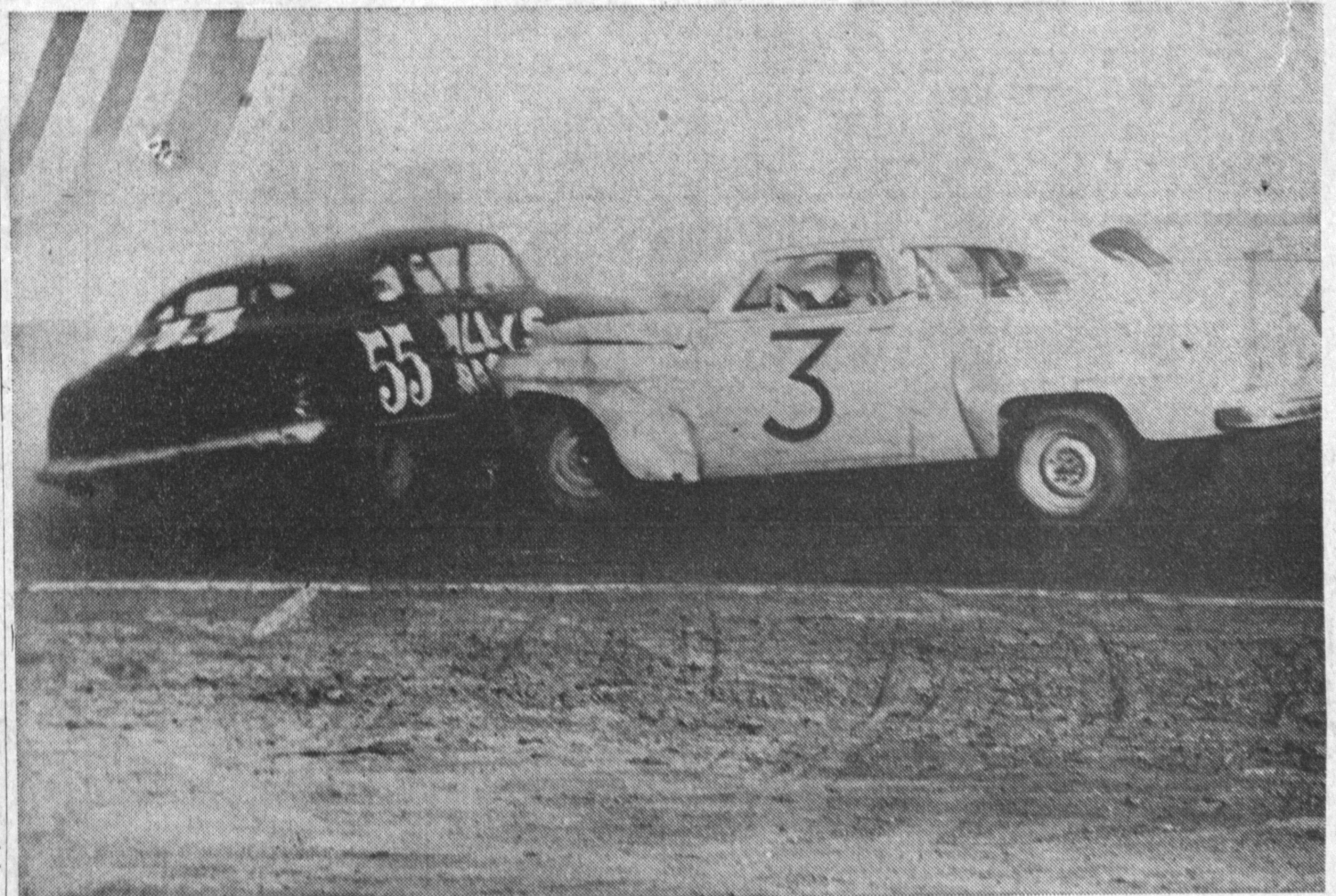

Motorcycle Steeplechase Set Tonight

Dick Dorresteyn of upstate San Pablo goes to the post the favorite tomorrow night in a motorcycle steeplechase program over a treacherous course at Ascot Park, 183rd and Vermont.

Dorresteyn, 1958 national champion, holds every record for the nine-turn circuit with its 10-foot barrier jump, from 49:55 for one lap to 12:39:96 for the 15-lap main event.

The largest field of the season, 120 riders, is ready for one lap qualifying at 7 p.m. First of the 1 races is at 8:30 p.m. under direction of J. C. Agajanian.

Along with Dorresteyn, four former national steeplechase champions are in the bulging field: Joe Leonard of San Jose, 1960 winner; Dick Mann, El Sobrante, 1957; Al Gunter, Los Angeles, 1956; and Eddie Kretz, Monterey Park, 1955.

Chief threat, however, is Dick Hammer of Lakewood, who upset Dorresteyn in the first night race of the season May 29 before a capacity crowd of 7407 fans. Another record turnout is anticipated for tonight's pre-holiday two-wheeling fireworks.

Oval-track point leader Neil Keen is another serious contender for Dorresteyn, Hammer and the former champions as are Jack O'Brien and Stu Morley, members of the famed BSA wrecking crew.
