SAFE WALKING TIPS



MALES, BEWARE

If you are a man, watch out when you cross the street. Three out of four adults killed in pedestrian traffic accidents last year were males, the Automobile Club of Southern California reports.

Men are naturally more aggressive, and, as a result, take greater risks. They also tend to have less patience for such things as waiting for the traffic light to change, or walking to the corner to cross the street.

Two other factors are the greater number of men on the streets at night, the worst time for pedestrian accidents, and the fact that women's light stockings reflect headlight beams better than men's dark trousers.

Whatever the reasons, it is high time men took stock of their walking habits, Whatever other ways they may be superior, they take second place to the ladies as safe pedestrians.
