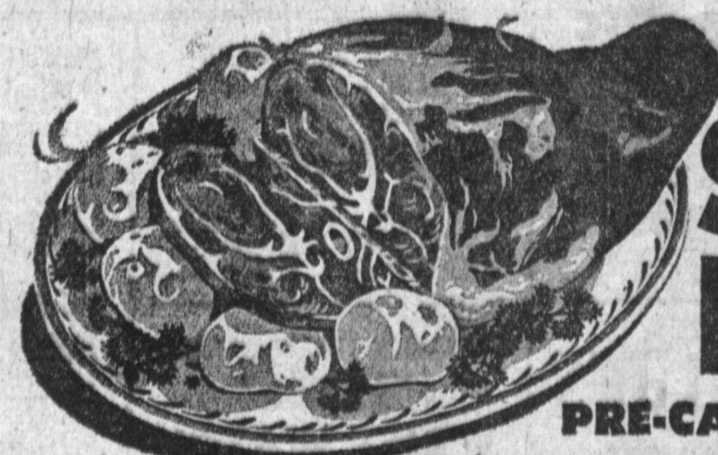

'Pretty' Bottles Can Be Hazards

Time was when household cleaners came in such ugly bottles and smelled so awful they were kept carefully out of sight. Now many of them are all dolled up, pretty to look at, pleasant to smell. So they're out on display in the kitchen, a danger to inquisitive young children.

Though practically every room in the house has its hazards for youngsters, the kitchen is beginning to take the lead. Detergents, bleaches, waxes, insecticides—children have been known to drink them all. Most of the youngsters who swallow the poisonous stuff are three years old

or younger, but the four and five year olds get their share, too.

Best of all is to keep all household preparations out of children's reach. If the young ones get to the stuff anyway, go to the nearest doctor or hospital emergency room.

You can try to induce vomiting yourself, but this should never be done if the child has drunk kerosene or anything corrosive. Since you can't always tell what's in whatever the child drank, you'd better let the doctor or hospital take care of it. Make a note of the brand name or, better yet, take the container with you.
