Operation and testing of transistors as well as their application to computers and compact devices of the space age will be presented in both lecture and laboratory phases of Electronics 22, Transistors.

The testing and troubleshooting of home television circuits will be emphasized in Electronics 21, Television Fundamentals, through the use of the oscilloscope and other laboratory equipment.
