Deck is a junior from Redondo Union High School who is participating in the seaside campus's special program for high school students. He was awarded a scholarship to attend UCSB Summer Session.

A superior academic record in college preparatory courses has made him eligible to take a full program of lower division college courses this summer at the Santa Barbara campus. Courses which are completed with satisfactory grades may later be submitted for credit evaluation at the college of his choice.

Twelve \$100 scholarships and one \$125 scholarship have been granted to outstanding applicants, All of the 130 high school students are living in the Las Casitas Residence Halls under the supervision of resident assistants. Meals are served in the modern De la Guerra dining commons.

A stimulating program of cultural events as well as recreational activities is offered during the summer session. Students have access to a mile and one half of universityowned beach at the edge of the campus and an Olympicsized swimming pool located on campus.
