## Buffalo Bill Comes to Life on KNXT Show

The legend of William Frederick Cody alias Buffalo Bill, including little known facts about the Western hero, will be presented by Dr. Herman Harvey on "The Touch of Fame," today July 30, 3 p.m., on Channel 2.

Cody, born in Iowa in 1846, was given the name Buffalo Bill at the early age of 14 when he used to shoot buffalo for the pioneers en route to California. He became a scout during the Indian Wars and later developed the famous Wild West Show. He refused to accept a seat in Congress though already elected without his consent, but took advantage of the "honorable" title which he always used in front of his name.

Dr. Harvey will trace the colorful man's life in show business and politics to illustrate how a legend is formed. Influential in the conservation movement, Cody has been referred to as the Father of Reclamation, introduced the

## Minow On "Space Log"

Mr. Newton Minow, FCC Chairman, makes a special appearance, via tape interview, to discuss Communications Satellites on the "Space Log" color series, Friday night, August 4th, 7:00-7:30 p.m. over KRCA (Channel 4).

NBC News Correspondent Ray Sherer met with Mr. Minow in Washington to tape the special segment in which Mr. Minow discusses building of satellite's for both Government and private industry.

To wrap up the story of Communications Satellites, regular series host, Roy Neal, interviews space scientist Dr. George Mueller, of Space Technology Laboratories, Inc., in Los Angeles; and a special recorded segment with a noted representative of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company will be featured. KRCA Director, Don Davies flew to New York over the past weekend to secure the added interview.

The result will be an extremely comprehensive coverage of the problems of communicating by satellite. The mechanics of the systems, the benefits to the users, and the regulatory problems involved will all be treated during the half-hour colorcast.

Communications satellites in a few short years may give us global live television; overseas telephone calls for about the same cost as present cross-country tolls, and worldwide data-link facilities for the harried businessman.

KRCA's complex three-city coverage of the Communications Satellite story would have been a simpler task, if there were a Communications Satellite system in use today.

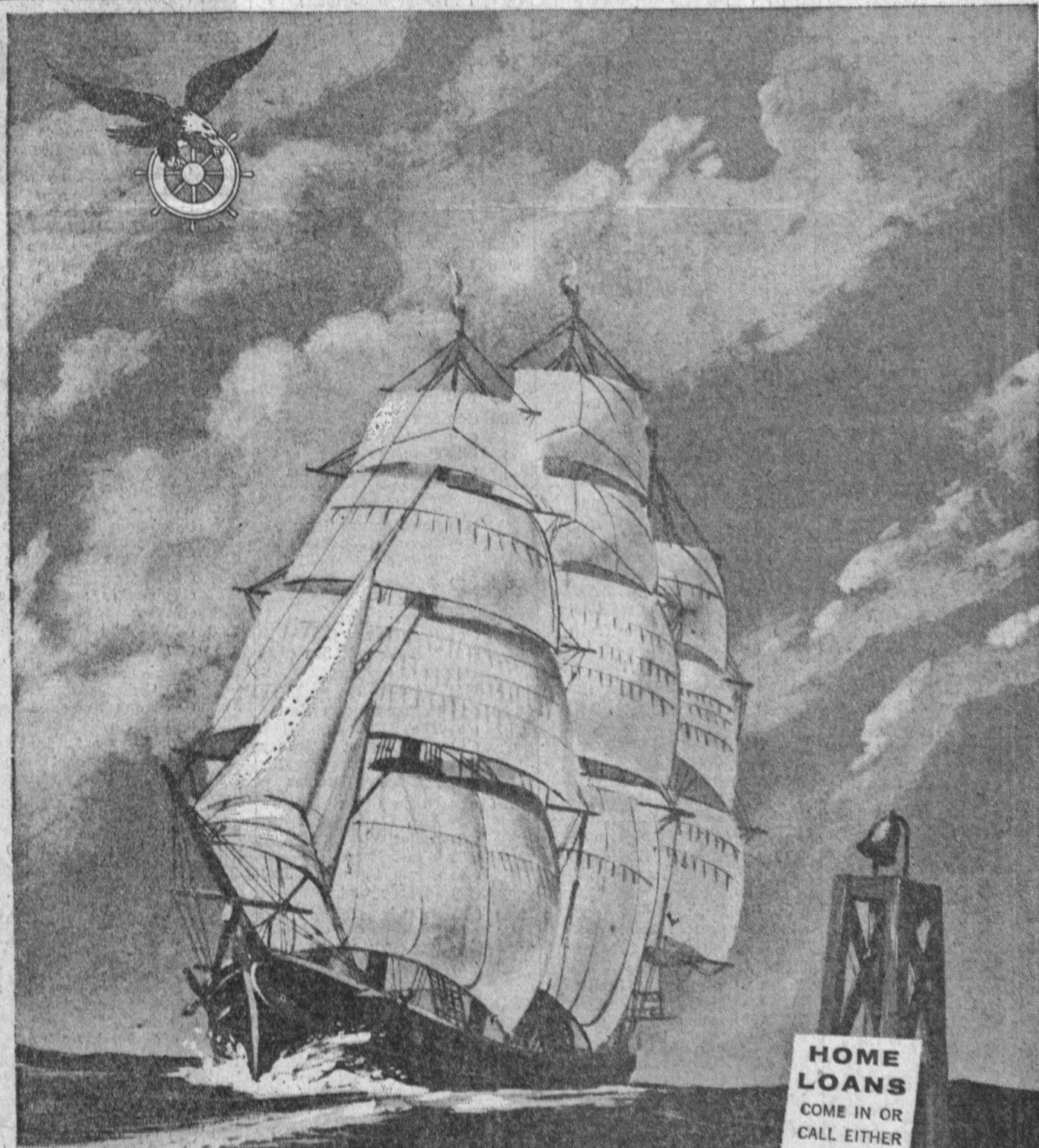
