

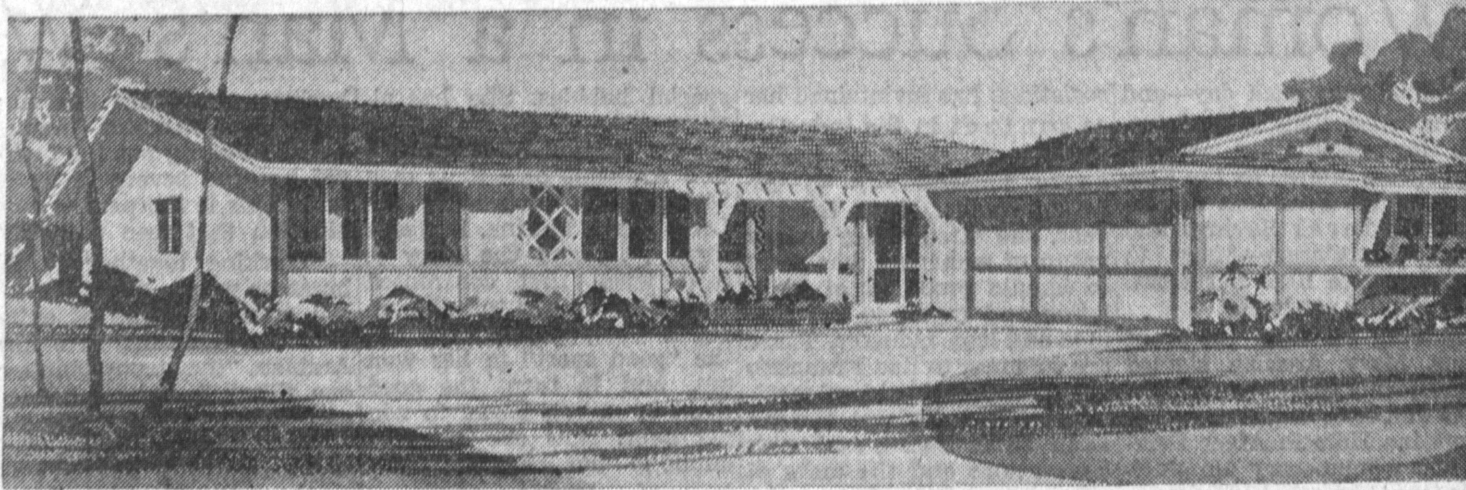
Young Politicians Slate Campaign
