Swiss, Australians Retain Pride as Neutral States

SWITZERLAND AND AUSTRIA, NEUTRALS

Both Switzerland and Austria pride themselves as being neutral countries. A survey I made of over 50 people seems to verify this feeling. However, it is my feeling that there is no such thing as neutrality. It is possible that a nation can be neutral in action but not in thought.

With this in mind, and with numerous and persistent questions, a number of interesting admissions came out. These nations that say they are neutral actually ignore the reality of our times—the battle between the forces of freedom and those of communism.

WON'T FACE UP

For example, a German woman, married to a Swiss resident of Lucerne for the past 40 years, said, "The Swiss do not want to face up to the menace of communism but delve into the past with such statements as 'we hate Germans'—However these same people are happy to take German money. Thousands of Germans and people from all over the world are able to stream across the Swiss border without so much as an examination of their passports."

Goods from all over the world are sold at special tourist export prices—far below the price which Swiss residents must pay for these commodities.

In Austria one sees a country which speaks the German language and is made up of people with German characteristics. However, the standard of living is far below that of Western Germany. I cannot help comparing the lack of business activity in this city of Innsbruck with the bustling activity found in the German cities of similar size. One cannot help visualizing what a blessing it would be for this country of seven million people to become a member of the Common Market.

ALOOF

Because of its neutralism and aloofness from this organization it has one of the lowest standards of living in Western Europe. Some of the more farsighted Austrians feel that their country would be better off under the government of Germany and as a member of the Common Market.

Austria is pressing the United Nations to settle the dispute of the Tyrol territory. Italy, of course, is the nation which controls the South Tyrol. A little country such as Austria has very little chance in winning a dispute of this caliber. However, if she were a part of Germany or a member of the Common Market her chances of being heard and her chances of recovery would be much greater.

This bears out my original statement that countries cannot be neutral in this age. They should either cast their lot with the forces of freedom or those of communism.

My next country to cover will be Italy.
