Torrance Youth To Attend Camp

A gala finale will be written to the 1961 summer camping season of the Crippled Children's Society when more than 120 handicapped youngsters embark Monday (August 14) for the fifth session at the Society's two camps, Paivika in the mountains and Joan Mier at the seashore.

Danny K. Morse, eight years old, of 134 East 213th St., Torrance, will be among the last group to attend Camp Paivika.

Ages 7 to 9, and representing all areas of Los Angeles County, the children will set forth by bus and station wagon from Society headquarters (325 West Adams Boulevard) for two free weeks of hiking, swimming, horseback-riding, cook-outs, archery and all the traditional camping activities, geared to the gentle pace demanded by the wheelchairs, crutches, braces and other aids the youngsters need.

Their headquarters will be two camps especially built by the society to serve the handicapped, one of them (Paivika, opened in 1946) the first of its kind in the nation. This is the second year for Camp Joan Mier, whose low-altitude site on the coast beyond Malibu was chosen to make camping possible for cardiac-handicapped children.

Oklahoma City, skippered by Capt. George R. Muse of New Castle, Pa., is equipped with the Talos supersonic surface-to-air missile.

"It will be a pleasure to renew acquaintances with my many Long Beach friends at the Zody's grand opening," Welsh stated.
