

Braves Lead In Tordondo League Play

Australian Sprint Star Expected To Compete In Aug. 18 Swim Meet

Murray Rose of Australia may be a surprise starter in the 100-meter free style on opening day of the National AAU Swimming Championships August 18 at the L.A. Swim Stadium.

Peter Daland, LAAC coach, turned in his entries Thursday to meet director John C. Fellows and named Rose for all free style races—100, 200, 400, and 150 meters.

No swimmer is permitted to compete in more than three individual events, so Daland will have to scratch

his Aussie Olympic champion from either the 10 or 1500, both on opening day.

"I fully believe Murray can win the 100," Daland told Fellows. "He's been exceptionally fast in practice; and, he comes to win, times of other swimmers are meaningless to him."

Daland's decision on Rose's events will not be learned until the coaches' scratch meeting Thursday night, Aug. 17.

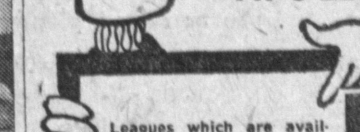
