Award Contract For East Torrance Storm Drainage

Supervisor Burton W. Chace Friday announced the award of a contract by the Board of Supervisors to the Norco Construction Co. of Artesia for

the East Torrance Storm Drain.

Firm's bid of \$586,726.80 was low among 10 proposals filed August 4 with the County flood control district.

It ran \$52,422.70 less than the engineer's estimated cost for the project, Chace said.

Construction of the key drainage project is slated to start within the next two or three weeks with completion set in about eleven months.

Route of the drain will effect portions of Del Amo Blvd., Arlington Ave., 190th St., Crenshaw Blvd., 188th St., Western Ave. and Torrance Blvd., Chace said.

Design of the project was directed by Torrance City Engineer W. M. Nollac. Construction, operation and maintenance of the structure will be supervised by Flood Control District Chief Engineer M. E. Salisbury.

Cost was included in the 1958 storm drain bond issue which allocated \$225,000,000 for the construction of 184 trunk drains in various critical County locations, the Supervisor added.

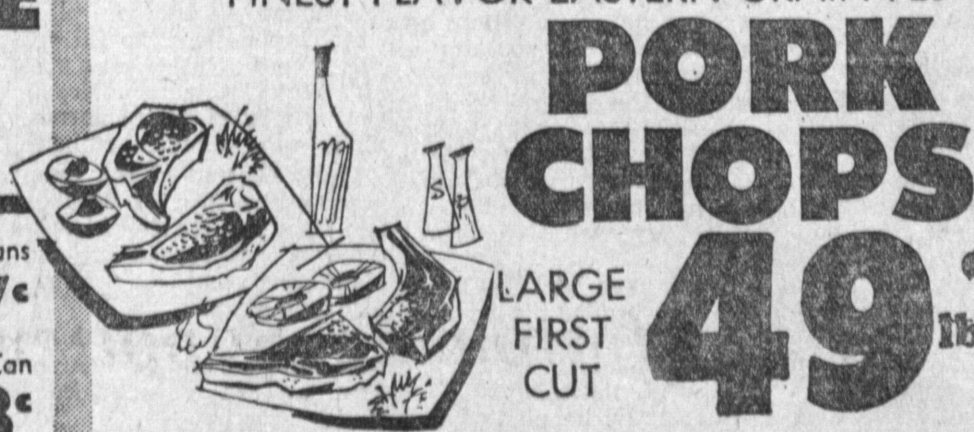
