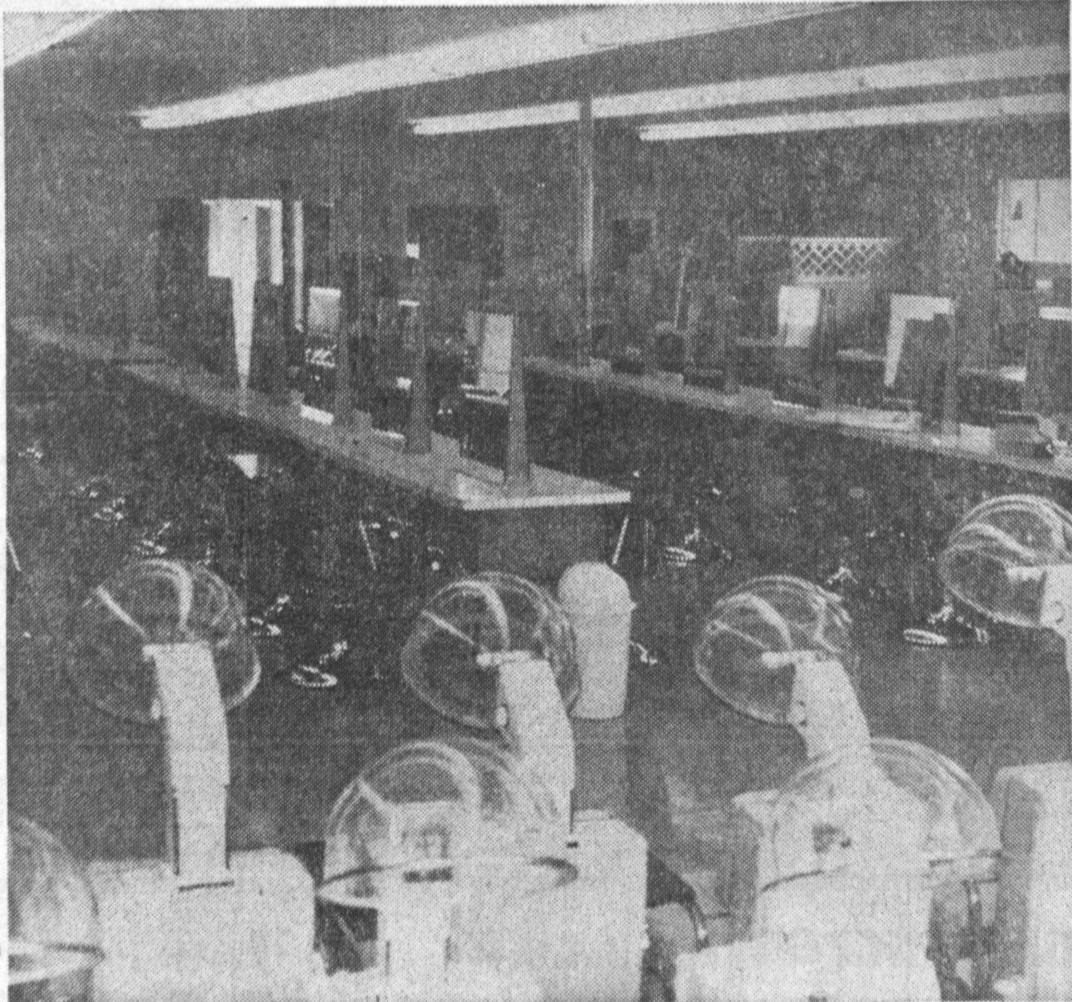
Carl Fisher, director of the program, is also one of the stars of the revue. Mrs. George Clay is an associate rector of the show that has already appeared before two capacity audiences.

## New Whale Joins Bubbles, Bimbo At Marineland

Bubbles and Bimbo, the performing whales at Marineland, got a new playmate today when a 10-foot female whale was netted from Catalina Channel and placed in the big circular tank at the oceanarium.

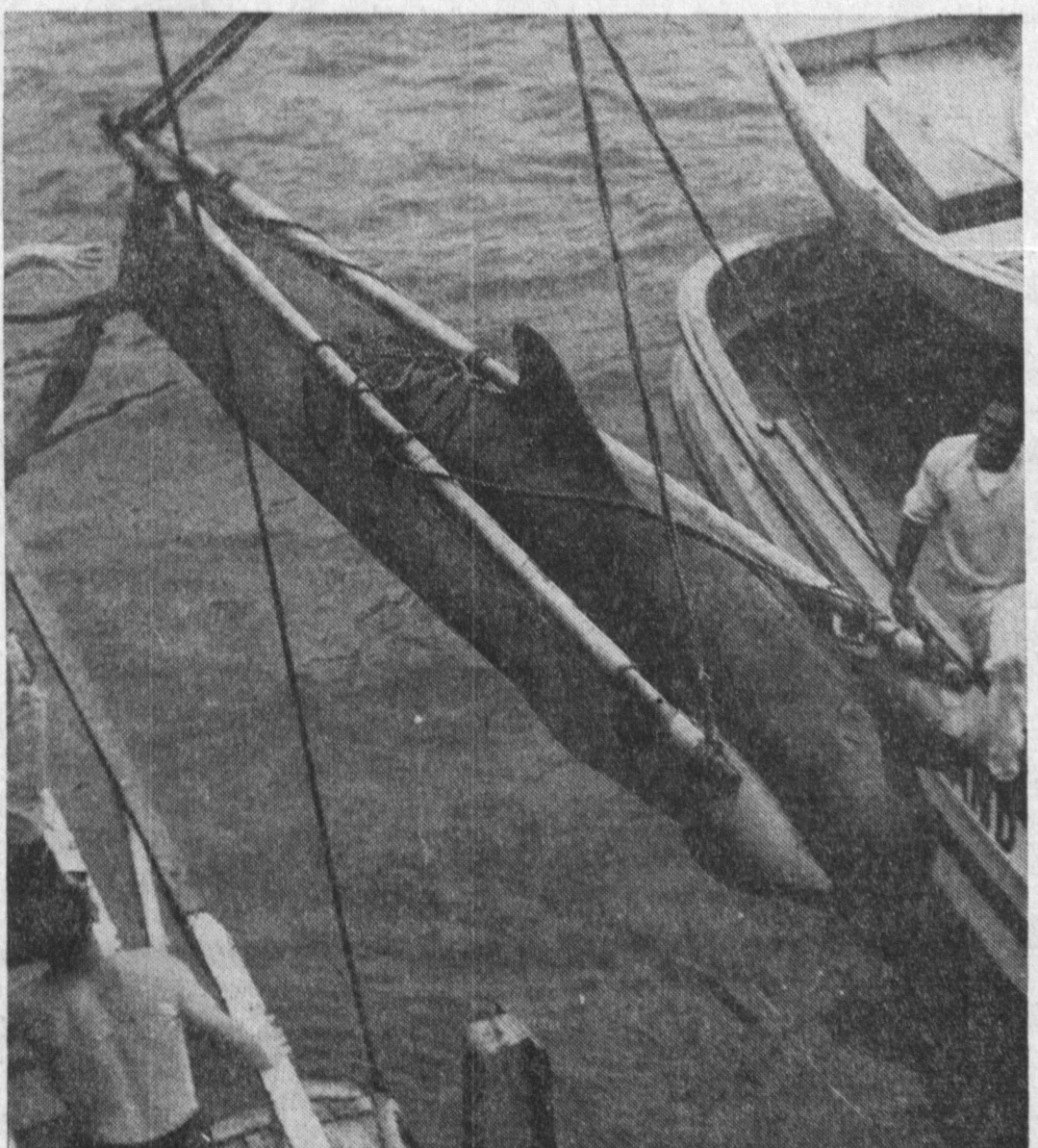
William F. Monahan, vice president and general manager of Marineland, said the new pilot whale would be named "Buttons" and would soon be doing such tricks as singing, dancing and leaping completely out of the water, long with the other members of the whale troupe.

Monahan reported that the young whale, probably not over four years old, was captured today in the ocean less than 10 miles from Marineland by the oceanarium's collecting crew aboard the vessel Geronimo. The whale was taken by Capt. Frank Brocate, chief collector of specimens for Marineland, and his assistant, Frank Calandrino. They are the only two men in history to capture a whale alive in the open sea and bring it ashore for public display.

After Buttons was placed in the whale tank, she immediately touched noses with Bimbo, the biggest whale in captivity in the world and the undisputed boss of the whale colony at Marineland. She was accepted at once into the whale community and began swimming around the tank with Bimbo, Bubbles and a third whale, Bubbles II.

For all reasons of room balance, it is a good idea for you to hang the drapery fabric to the floor and ignore the fact that you have a high window. Having one drape long and one short gives the same effect as one pant leg rolled up and one down.

In general I would say yes, but accent rugs should be selected very carefully for color and texture content and

should be placed in specific locations in the room, such as under a coffee table in front of a sofa; using complementary colors to accent the area in front of the sofa is but one of many areas accent rugs may be used.
