Miss Darrin will be present all day August 20, the final day of the Festival, during the 32-mile paddleboard race from the Isthmus of Catalina Island to Manhattan Beach State Pier, the longest Paddleboard race in the world.

She will be a member of the greeting party as winning paddlers cross the finish line between 11 a.m. and noon, at Manhattan Beach Pier.

Miss Darrin recently finished casting the female lead role in "The Broken Land," for 20th Century-Fox. As a recording star, she has cut

"I Love The Way" and "Gimme a Little Kiss Will Ya Huh?" which now number among the 10 most popular records nationwide.
