Retarded School Has Vacancies

Soon it will be back to school again, and for many children returning to the Garden Valley Training Center these words have a special meaning. For many of them this will be the first time they will be going back to school.

Last year at this time there was no place for these children to go. Many had never seen the inside of a classroom.

The Garden Valley Association for Mentally Retarded Children was formed last September to help correct this situation. On November 1, 1960 a class was opened in temporary quarters at Southwest Temple Beth Torah. In May of this year the present facility was ready and another class was added bringing the capacity to 44.

This year a number of children are being accepted into public schools making room for more who are not so fortunate.

More than 20 are enrolled for fall term with room for about 20 more children. The fee based on the cost sharing plan is \$35 per month.
