Cook, Heinis Compete Saturday For Stock Car Title

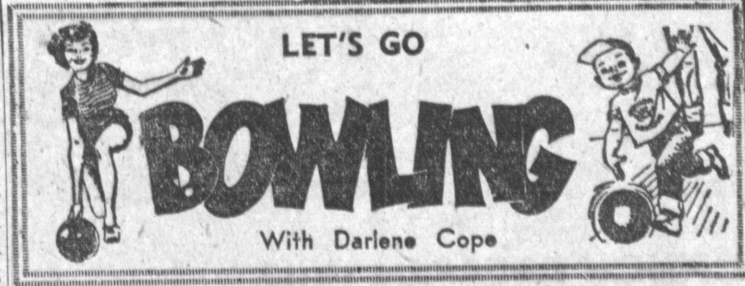

Conference Fall Schedule

Metropolitan Conference teams, facing the toughest and most attractive schedule in conference history, open practice for the 1961 season Friday, September 1.

First games are scheduled September 22. Conference play starts October 6.

The conference enters the campaign rated one of the toughest of the nation's junior college loops. L. B. Chapman of the All-America Grid Index rates three of the teams — Junior Rose Bowl champion Long Beach City College, Bakersfield and Santa Monica City College — among the nation's top 11 junior college squads. These three meet each other in the last three weeks of the season.
