Minted Leg of Lamb
Treat your family to a mint lamb delight. Prepare Leg of Lamb for roasting by cutting a slit and inserting 1 clove of garlic. Salt, pepper and paprika well. Add a pinch of ginger and rosemary. Roast in 350° oven, allowing 20 to 25 minutes per pound. Baste with Mint Sauce every 15 minutes or so, allowing drippings to mingle with lamb drippings. About an hour before serving, add peeled potatoes and 1 cup of water. Add 1/2 cup of mint sauce. Drippings become excellent gravy.
