The school thrift program, which has changed little in the 50 years since Giannini founded it, is the largest this year that it has ever been.

There are presently 1,408,118 school savings accounts in the Bank's program. The average size of these accounts, started with nickels and dimes, is \$26.62.

The bank absorbs a substantial loss each year in order to bring this service to the schools.


