Schedule Special Citizenship Program For Youngsters Enrolled in Local Schools

Special programs are being planned in the Torrance Schools in recognition of Constitution and Citizenship Week, tomorrow through Sept. 22. Teachers and students are planning special events in commemoration of the adoption of the Constitution such as school-wide exercises, assemblies, bulletin boards and other programs to which parents are being invited.

In pre-planning sessions with principals, Superintendent J. H. Hull reminded the

group that citizenship and patriotism are not seasonal activities but should be studied and practiced throughout the year. "We, as teachers, should be constantly alert to the importance of citizenship training of pupils by guiding them to put into practice the principles of American patriotism, and citizenship taught in our social studies classes," he said.

The Board of Education has shown its feelings toward perpetuating throughout the school year a program of patriotism by directing that all schools in Torrance will conduct flag raising ceremonies daily at which time students will come to attention and sing the "Star Spangled Banner." The Daily Pledge of allegiance to the Flag of the

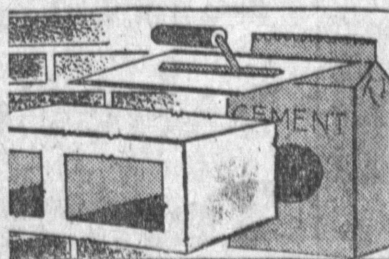

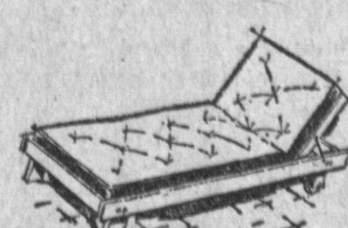
