## Youth Bands Auditioning Scheduled For Saturday

Auditions for young musicians who wish to become members of the Torrance Area Youth Bands or the Junior Symphony Orchestra will be held Saturday morning, Sept. 23, from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m., in Waleria Park Recreation Building, corner of Pacific Coast Highway and Hawthorne Boulevard, Waleria.

Musicians are reminded to bring instruments and music they wish to play.

The Torrance Area Youth Bands consist of two groups, the Youth Band, composed of students of the upper three grades of high school, and the Junior Youth Band made up of students of the 7th, 8th, and 9th grades.

Both bands are directed by James Van Dyck, and supported by the parents and the City of Torrance through their youth music promotion program.

The Youth Band, consisting of around 45 high school musicians, centers its activities on the performance of concerts and special events staged around the community.

The Junior Band, of around 85 young junior high school age musicians, not only plays concerts for local events but also participates in many out-of-town parades throughout the year. The Junior Band's last outing was for the Waleria Businessmen's "Round-up" Parade held in Waleria on Sept. 10.

The next event scheduled is participation in the half-time review at the USC-Georgia Tech football game at the Coliseum Friday night, Sept. 22.

The Junior Symphony Orchestra, organized last spring, consists of musicians of both junior high and high school age. The Orchestra is also sponsored by the Torrance Youth Bands and is under the direction of Mr. William Heffernan, a member of the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

Weekly rehearsals are held for all three groups.
