Red Nichols, With Cornet, Entertains In Area For Nine-Week Engagement

Red Nichols, one of the most enduring musical institutions in American jazz, came swinging back to Marineland Restaurant in Palos Verdes this week for his fourth engagement, tooting his high-sounding cornet and leading his "Five Pennies" in the Porpoise Room.

Their jazz treatment of the old Dixieland favorites and Nichols' solos were well received.

The musical idol of the 20's, signed by owner George M. Foster, will entertain in Marineland Restaurant nightly except Mondays until mid-November.

Unlike mahjong and spats, which have disappeared from the scene, Nichols is one of today's top musical attractions, winning a whole new generation of fans with records, television and in-person appearances.

"There's a large, eager and devoted audience for his kind of music," stated Foster, who has been showcasing many living musical legends in the Porpoise Room.

They have included Wild Bill Davidson, Clyde McCoy, The Ink Spots and Ray Ba-due.

"Red Nichols offers listen-

able jazz. He avoids the far-off stuff, and my patrons literally stand up and applaud after every set," Foster said.

The jazz presented by Nichols in Marineland Restaurant is a true art form, not a frenzied and prodigious profusion of notes. Clutching his cornet, he plays them with a round, driving, controlled sonority. The virtuoso of the horn segues neatly from brassy, muted thunder into a stream of jazz sounds, exposing his hot-noted band to infinite improvisation or rhythmic simplicity.

"The Five Pennies," led by Nichols, will be on the band stand for nine more weeks, and reservations in the Porpoise Room are suggested by Foster.

Fifty of the world's Dixieland Jazzmen will appear at Disneyland, Saturday night.



Sept. 30, when the second annual "Dixieland at Disneyland" show fills the Magic Kingdom with New Orleans music and fun.

Louis Armstrong heads the list of Dixieland talent. Joining "Satchmo" for the jazz festival will be: Teddy Buckner and his Dixieland Band; The Firehouse Five Plus 2; The Young Men From New Orleans; Matty Matlock and his Dixieland All-Stars; the Disneyland Strawhatters; and the Albert McNeil Choir.

Six Locations
The entire show, including river pagentry and the evening-long Dixieland dancing and listening at six locations, is wrapped up in one big ticket "package" that includes admission to Disneyland and admission to every Disneyland ride and attraction as often as desired throughout the night.

Advance sale tickets, at \$4.95, can be obtained at Wallich's Music City Ticket agencies (Hollywood, Lakewood

and Downtown), Desmond's Stores at Pasadena, Crenshaw and Fashion Square in Santa Ana, and the Disneyland Box Office.

All tickets on Sept. 30, are \$5.50. Gates open at 8 p.m.

Like the first "Dixieland at Disneyland" held in the Magic Kingdom a year ago, this year's program will begin on the Park's Rivers of America with the "Salute to Dixieland" show.

Kingston Trio, Les Baxter Play September 30

The recently reorganized Kingston Trio will be back for the third time at Hollywood Bowl, Sept. 30, under the sponsorship of Concerts, Inc. The preceding appearances in 1959 and 1960 were complete sellouts.

Augmenting the Sept. 30 Bowl show will be Les Baxter, and his 30-piece recording orchestra. Baxter has scores of "hit parade" recordings and albums to his credit.

The Kingstons are probably the top money makers in the music business today, reportedly earning \$1 million a year for the last four years.

Their income comes from a variety of enterprises, including Kingston Trio shirts, belts and slacks; a restaurant in Sausalito, their albums, TV guest spots and commercials, real estate holdings, and their appearances all over the U. S. and the Orient.

The Trio is hard-working, spending hours each day rehearsing old as well as new songs and routines. The group has a large repertoire, and could probably perform for two days running without doing the same number over again.

Newest member of the team is John Stewart, a lanky six-footer from Pomona.

Each band will play in its own distinctive style.

For the finale, more than 50 jazz artists board the Mark Twain riverboat. Under a display of fireworks exploding on the water and in the air, the sternwheeler, ablaze with lights, will round the bend with musicians playing
