National Champs to Vie Saturday at Drag Races

Pete Robinson of Atlanta, Georgia, over-all winner at the recent NHRA Nationals in Indianapolis, has announced his entry in this Saturday night Western Drag Racing championships at Long Beach. Off his performance at the Nationals, Robinson has to be favored, however, Tom McEwen of Long Beach may have a home strip edge. McEwen won the first round of the Western championships two weeks ago and Zane Shubert of Santa Ana won last week's second round giving them each 1,000 in prize money.

Robinson defeated McEwen on three different occasions back east, so for the fiery little king of local drag racing this return match is a grudge race.

Also highly regarded, is Gordon Collett from Portsmouth, Ohio, who is entered in this week's meet. Collett is listed as the No. 2 driver in the country behind National Champion Jack Chrisman, Compton.

Chrisman has been in the two earlier meets, but was unable to make his car run up to expectations. National record holder Lefty Muddersbach of Pico-Rivera blew an engine to keep him out of

the first and second round finals, however, he should make his presence felt the final two weeks.

Other drivers that are capable of winning the \$1,000 are Doda Martin of Carlsbad, Bob Muravez of Burbank, Dick Donnelly of Van Nuys, Glen Stokely of Redondo Beach, Leland Kolb of Buena Park, Jesse Schrank of San Francisco and Roger Wolford of Torrance.

Time trials will start at 2, with final eliminations at 6:30.

Gray Favored in Saturday 100-Lap Ascot Grand Prix

Eddie Gray of Gardena, now driving out of San Fernando for Galpin Motors impressive team, rates as a prohibitive favorite in Saturday night's 100-lap Grand Prix NASCAR late model stock car race at Ascot Park, 183rd and Vermont.

First race is scheduled for 8:30 p.m., with time trials getting under way at 7 p.m.

Gray, winner of no less than eight major stock car events this year on the west coast, has been plenty tough on Ascot's half-mile, dirt track this year, already winning three races there this season.

His last Ascot win, however, was tinged with the blessing of Lady Luck which saw the veteran pilot easing in for an unexpected win when almost certain winner Don Noel of Arleta blew a tire on the 99th lap to allow Gray to win.

Since then he has added a 100-lap win at Sacramento to his win collection, but last week finished a sad twelfth to winner Lloyd Dane of Buena Park at Antioch when his speedy No. 98, '61 Ford developed transmission trouble.

The aforementioned Dane, actually Gray's arch-rival, now has his potent '61 red Chevy No. 44 in fettle again. He upset Gray also last May in the famed Riverside 100-miler.

Others in contention will be the likes of Ron Hornaday, Gray's Galpin teammate and winner at Ascot and Sausalito; hard-luck Noel and Eddie Pagan of Lynwood; Clem Proctor of Compton in a rebuilt 1960 Pontiac; Bob Ross of Lakewood, second at Antioch in a new 1961 Olds; and a field of more than twenty others.
