Champion Cyclists Will Compete Sunday in Palos Verdes Races

Grand Prix bicycle races of Palos Verdes will be launched Sunday morning, it was reported yesterday by representatives of the Palos Verdes Police Department and the PV Kiwanis, co-sponsors of the event.

Races will start Sunday morning at 7:30 a.m. The race will start at the Palos Verdes Plaza. Assembly will be at 7 a.m., and registrations will be taken at that time.

There will be four classes of riders. Class A and B will ride three laps, Class C will ride two laps and the novices will ride one lap. Each lap will be 16 miles around.

Class A will consist of Olympic riders and top ranking cyclists. Class G will consist of riders that are consistent winners but never in the first four places. Class C are riders that have graduated from the novice class and have won awards while novices are the new members that are starting for the first time.

Riders will ride independently in each class for prizes so a novice will have an equal chance of winning.

Riders from San Diego to Fresno have already submitted entries for the race. Heading the roster of participants is Olympic champion Dave Sharp.

Also contending will be 65 year old Monty Montgomery, one of Southern California's best riders. Montgomery was recently awarded the Best All-Around Award for the year 1961.

County Schedules Work on Lomita Water District

Supervisor Burton W. Chace announced today construction would begin in about two weeks in Waterworks District No. 13, Lomita, of a new water supply system of 6, 8, and 10-inch diameter lines, replacing an old and obsolete installation. Service connection and fire hydrants will be included in the work to bring the service in the section up to present day standards.

The area to be served lies between Crenshaw Blvd. and Narbonne Ave. on the east and west, and 241st St. on the north and Lomita Blvd. on the south.

Ten contractors submitted bids to County Engineer John A. Lambie ranging from a low of \$48,488 to \$66,835 with the Card Construction Company, Inc. of Newport Beach the apparent low bidder.

Supervisor Chace indicated that a contract should be awarded by the Board of Supervisors within the next 10 days and the construction work would be completed in about four months time.

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas Officiates At Torrance Area Hospital Groundbreaking

Groundbreaking ceremonies were held today for a \$375,000 convalescent hospital in San Pedro to serve the harbor-Peninsula areas.

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas joined with Dr. Maurice D. Okum and Associates, developers, in the traditional ceremony.

The ultra-modern facilities will be erected on a Sixth St. site in San Pedro, west of the Community Hospital in a medical complex.

Dr. Okum stressed that the one story structure will look more like a country club than a medical building.

Kenneth McCulloch will serve as administrator of the hospital. Prominent in medical circles throughout the Southland, McCulloch has drawn upon his experience to design the structure to meet every need, physical and spiritual, of the convalescents. Initial outlay for the structure was more than \$95,000 for acquisition of the one-and-a-half acre site, which is the remaining parcel of land within the community to accommodate the sprawling modern hospital.


The structure will be built roughly in the shape of a small "h".




