Your Decorating Problems Answered

Mr. Wallace: I have beige tweed carpeting and green walls and drapes. I would like to repaint and buy new draperies. I must keep my old furniture which is maple and also in beige browns, with two gold club chairs in the room. I would like you to suggest a color for my walls and drapes.—P.T., Torrance.

P.T.: This sounds like the makings of a very pleasing room. I suggest that you paint the walls a very soft beige, almost a natural and match your draperies as close as possible. Try to keep the texture of the draperies as simple as possible so you do not conflict with the tweed textures elsewhere.

Mr. Wallace: I would like some advice on hanging pictures. Where do you hang them properly in a room, which wall, should all the walls have something hanging on them or is there a set rule? Please comment in your column.—Mrs. Thomas, Torrance.

Mrs. Thomas: You should not hang pictures on every wall. Use picture treatment in points of interest, such as over a sofa, over a chair, fireplace, hi-fi, etc. It is always good to hang pictures over something rather than just fill the walls. Pictures create interest and color, also warmth. Use them wisely.

New class in the course started Monday at South High School, and today at Torrance High School. Although enrollment for these two evenings is nearly completed, additional classes will be started in November and January. Dates for these will be announced as soon as they have been approved by the State Department of Education.

The Individual and Family Survival course is different from the Civil Defense program that so many have heard about. It is intended to provide the individual family with information they will need in the event of an emergency.

It is not intended to discuss those things that will be done in case of emergency, by the Civil Defense Corps, law enforcement officers, fire departments, Red Cross, and military forces, but rather to discuss the psychological effect such emergencies will have upon the public, with a view to offering information that will help them to know what to know what to do to meet the emergencies.

The course, then is intended to help people to alleviate their fears, which in turn will prevent panic.

In an all-out emergency, uncontrolled panic is sure to result in a great deal of loss of life which could otherwise be prevented if the people learn to exercise control of themselves; because, survival is pretty much an individual problem.

In the classes discussion is held on those things that have been made known to the instructors from Federal and State sources. Suggestions are also being offered that should be helpful to each and every family in this community.
