Road Project in Palos Verdes to End This Month

A roadway improvement project on Crenshaw Blvd. from Indian Peak Road to approximately 0.4 mile northerly is progressing as scheduled by the Los Angeles County/ Road Department and will continue during the week of Oct. 23, Supervisor Burton W. Chace reported Friday.

Work in the Palos Verdes Peninsula area consists of extending the pavement on the westerly side of the roadway to join recently constructed curb and gutter






