What are Southern California's teen-agers really like?

What are their thoughts on dating, marriage, the automobile, education, religion and parents?

These and other thoughtprovoking questions will be answered in KNXT's hourlong documentary "The Intense Generation" on Thanksgiving Day, Thurs-day, Nov. 23, 9 to 10 p.m. on Channel 2.

"The Investigators" on the CBS Television Network will be pre-empted this date only.

The prime-time holiday special will provide new insight into this unique stratum of modern-day society. Unlike many other pro-

grams on the subject, "The Intense Generation" is not so much an adult evaluation of the teen-ager as it is a self-appraisal.

The purpose is to provide the adult with an idea and an understanding of who the teen-ager is, what he does, what he thinks and to some degree why - all through his own eyes and in his own words.

KNXT camera crews have filmed on-location segments in Sacramento of a teen-age model legislature, in Newport-Balboa during Easter week, at a San Bernardino drag strip, at Dorsey High School, Disneyland, and the Hollywood Bowl, at tea dances, formals, football games, church groups, beaches and record shops. The program is not designed as a sociological study but is geared towards capturing the thoughts, moods, hopes and the ten-


