

Educational Science Show Gains Wide Acceptance

"Science in Action," Southern California Edison Company's new public service television program, is gaining wide acceptance by school officials as a teaching aid, G. L. Blanchard, Edison district manager, reported today.

Edison announced the availability of classroom worksheet kits for teachers two weeks ago, and more than 900 requests for the kits have already been received, Blanchard said.

"We are extremely pleased with the interest being shown in our TV series, both from educators and the general viewing public as well, he said.

The kits are intended to help teachers supplement in their classrooms the material used on the television program each week, he explained.

30-MINUTE SHOW
The half-hour show, presented Thursdays at 7 p.m. over KRCA, Channel 4, explores subjects as new as space travel and as old as the solar system, with Dr. Earl S. Herald, prominent California scientist, as program host.

In addition to specialized treatment of the subject of each show, Dr. Herald al-

ways concludes the program in informative—and sometimes hilarious—fashion by introducing his "Animal of the Week."

This is the first time "Science in Action" has been offered in the Southland, Blanchard pointed out.

The show has won 16 national awards, however, and established a three-year average of holding 30 percent of the total viewing audience in northern California, he said.

"The program has proved conclusively that science and entertainment can be merged satisfactorily," he said.

Adventists Sign Anti-Alcohol, Smoking Pledge

Members of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, 1610 Acacia Ave., began a world-wide, every-member pledge signing campaign Saturday.

David de Waal, temperance director of the church, said the local congregation is joining some 13,000 other Adventist church congregations of more than 1,000,000 members around the world in the signature campaign.

Purpose of the campaign, according to de Waal, is to dramatize Adventists' belief that alcohol and tobacco are harmful to the body which the Bible calls "the temple of the Holy Spirit."

De Waal said the pledge being signed reads: "Realizing the importance of a healthy body and mind, I promise, God helping me, to totally abstain from the use of alcoholic beverages and tobacco in any form and to help influence others to do the same."

Local signatures will be added to a giant scroll which will be publicly shown at the 49th world convention of Seventh-day Adventists in San Francisco in August 1962, de Waal said.

Pastor Glenn Goffar led his congregation as the first signer of the pledge, de Waal reported.
