Rabbis, Delegates Attend Convention

Leaders from Reform temples in the Los Angeles area will be part of the largest Jewish gathering in the western hemisphere beginning Saturday in Washington, D.C.

Delegates will come from all over the United States, Canada, Panama and West Indies for the 46th General Assembly of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations at the Sheraton-Park Hotel.

Judge Emil N. Baar, UAHC board chairman, said that more than 3,000 lay leaders, rabbis and official visitors are expected for the six-day convention of the UAHC, founded in 1875 and now the nation's oldest Jewish religious institution.

National President
They will be headed by Dr. Maurice N. Eisendrath, national president of the union, who will chart a future course for its 630 affiliated reform temples with 1,000,000 members in his "State of Our Union" message.

Another leader of reform Jewry to address the assembly will be Dr. Nelson Glueck, president of the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, which is under the patronage of the UAHC and is the world's oldest existing rabbinical seminary.

Heading the Southland delegation to Washington will be Robert M. Kramer, Pacific Southwest Council president, and Rabbi Solomon F. Kleinman, western regional director.

Playing prominent roles as national vice-chairmen of the UAHC will be Louis A. Chase and Dr. George Piness. Isadore C. Gordean will be present as a member of the national board.

Convention Theme
Theme of the convention is "Judaism and Democracy," and the delegates will probe the relevance of Reform Judaism to such issues as civil rights, world peace, church state relations and civil defense.
