

Christmas Relief Collection Begins

The 1961 Catholic Bishops' Clothing Collection for overseas relief will take place during Thanksgiving Week, Nov. 19 to 26. It was announced today by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James E. Dolan, Los Angeles director.

Families are asked to bring used clothing, blankets, bedding and shoes to their parish churches during the week.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society will collect the bundles for processing and shipment overseas.

Supplies will be distributed by Catholic Relief Services in 64 countries around the globe to the needy, regardless of race, color or creed, Msgr. Dolan said.

Expanded Series

During the past year the service expanded its activities among the developing countries of Africa, the destitute areas of Latin American and the exiles of the Far East.

It also met emergencies in Florida, Morocco, Formosa and Japan, aiding refugees from Cuba, drought-afflicted families suffering famine and typhoon devastation and ruin.

The service also supplies U.S. Government surplus foods, medicals, hospital equipment and supplies.

Most urgently needed now, according to Msgr. Dolan, are men's suits, pants, shirts, work clothes and workshoes; children's clothing layettes for infants and

practical articles of women's clothing.

St. Vincent de Paul Society's annual appeal for Christmas funds will begin Thanksgiving Day, according to Msgr. Dolan.

Thousands of families and individuals will benefit by the society's Christmas program, Msgr. Dolan said.

Gifts will be provided for needy families through 115 parish conferences, for homeless, transient men through the St. Vincent de Paul Service Center at 717 S. Burlington Ave., and Mission House at 231 Winston St.

Hospital Patients

Patients at General Hospital, Rancho Los Amigos, five Veterans Administration hospitals and other public institutions and prisoners in city and county jails, honor farms and road camps, will also be aided.

Seamen from all parts of the world will find a merry Christmas and New Year's at Catholic Maritime Clubs of San Pedro and Wilmington, sponsored by the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Families not receiving care from other agencies will receive holiday food supplies, including all the ingredients for Christmas dinner, plus warm clothing, home furnishings and toys, as needed.

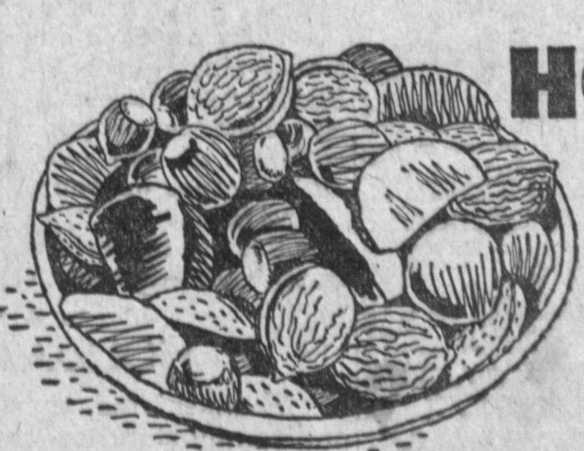
