


Defending champion for the 150-lap even over the half-mile Gardena raceway will be national big car champion and Indianapolis winner A. J. Foyt of Houston.

Metro Crown on the Line At Next Saturday's Game

The Metropolitan Conference football race, dramatic all season long, reaches its climax Saturday when Santa Monica and Bakersfield, unbeaten titans among the nation's junior colleges, battle at Bakersfield's 16,500-seat Memorial Stadium.

The storybook finish was set up last week when Santa Monica came from behind to smash Long Beach, 30-14, while Bakersfield strong-armed San Diego, 57-0. In other Metro conflicts, East Los Angeles beat Valley College, 28-6, and El Camino blanked Harbor College, 46-0.

Other conference games going this week are El Camino at East Los Angeles on Friday, Valley College at Long Beach on Saturday and Harbor College at San Diego on Saturday. All four kick-offs are at 8 p.m.

CHAMPIONSHIP On the line at Bakersfield will be the conference championship and consideration for the Junior Rose Bowl. The game, one of the greatest sports attractions in Bakersfield history, has long been sold out. Compton's 12-6 upset of Glendale last week left Bakersfield and Santa Monica the only perfect record junior clubs in Southern California.

The contest has wrought so much local interest that Bakersfield theaters have booked in closed circuit television of it, even though the struggle is right in town.

The outcome itself revolves on the question of whether Santa Monica's aerial circus, directed by quarterback Rand Carter, can penetrate an almost unbelievable Renegade defense

El Camino in Topheavy Victory Over Seahawks

El Camino's Warriors clobbered the Harbor College Seahawks Saturday afternoon, 46-0, in a rousing, action-packed finale for annual Homecoming festivities.

Slashing away at the Seahawks' defensive line, the Warriors racked up 12 points in the first quarter, six points in the second, 22 in the third period and another six in the last quarter.

Scoring for El Camino were Fitzgerald on a recovered fumble, Torok on a quarterback sneak, Hearne on a line plunge, Allison on a line plunge, Steinbeck, end run, Thagard on a 54-yard punt return, Taylor on a 42-yard pass interception return. Points after touchdown were picked up by Pier on a run and Andrews on a pass from Riley.

263 YARDS

A total of 263 yards rushing and 156 yards passing brought the El Camino rolling offense a total of 419 yards.

Twenty-two first downs were picked up by the El Camino eleven in an aggressive drive that never let up.

Cycle Rivalry Renewed Sunday At Saugus Meet

Dick Dorresteyn of San Pablo and Dick Hammer of Lakewood renew their north vs. south motorcycle TT rivalry in an AMA sanctioned steeplechase at Saugus Stadium Sunday afternoon, Nov. 19.

Matinee pro racing starts at 2:30 p.m., under the direction of J. C. Agajanian, with morning scrambles at 9:30 a.m. One admission price prevails for the double-header.

Saugus Stadium, with a specially designed TT course utilizing both the paved oval and the dirt infield, with a hair-raising jump tossed in, is located three miles north of Newhall, off Highway 6.

In two steeplechases conducted by Agajanian at Saugus, Hammer and Dorresteyn broke even. Dorresteyn won the opener, under the lights in September, with Hammer coming back in the first daylight event Oct. 8.

ASCOT WIN

Dorresteyn won Sunday, Nov. 5, around Ascot's twist and turn course to give him a 7-6 edge in 13 1961 races over his Southland foe, Hammer, however, holds a 104 point margin over Dorresteyn in official standings.

Other expert class riders along with the co-favorites for Sunday at Saugus include Jack O'Brien, Santa Monica; Clark White, Bakersfield; Dave Boston, Daly City; Jack Simmons, Artesia; Jim Goldsmith, Long Beach, and Chuck Minert, Whittier.

Harbor's vain attempts at cracking the Warrior defensive line were stopped cold as the Seahawks were held to just 91 yards advance.

The challengers managed to work their way into El Camino territory only twice during the session.

First touchdown of the afternoon came in the first quarter when Tom Fitzgerald, Warrior tackle, recovered a fumble of teammate Jim Allison in the Harbor endzone.

Allison made up for the almost-lost score, however, in the third period when he smashed through the Seahawks defense for the first score of the quarter.
