Indians Thank Adventists for Food, Clothing

Hundreds of Navajo Indians living in Monument Valley sent thanks to Torrance this week for food and clothing recently collected here for them.

The food and clothing was collected in Torrance on Halloween eve by members of the local Seventh-day Adventist Church's Pathfinder Youth Club as a "treat for Navajos" instead of a trick in the traditional manner.

"Hundreds of these proud, 'original' Americans are in need of this warm clothing," Dr. J. Lloyd Mason said.

"Although this is the desert the temperature here frequently skids below 20 degrees. One of the reasons for the high number of respiratory difficulties the Indians have is because they do not possess adequate clothing," the mission director said.

Altogether more than 19 tons of food and clothing has been collected in Torrance and other southern California communities for this special Navajo relief effort.

"Very few Navajos can speak English," Mason said. "But if they could they would surely say a very special 'Thanks' to every good person in Torrance who made this practical person-to-person help possible," he concluded.


