

Referring to burglaries in county territory, Pitchess said in a special statistical study during the current "Burn a Light" campaign, that out of some 269 after dark felonies, 171 or 74 per cent were committed with the lights off.

Among the remaining 98, many were committed when criminals had staked out a house, or otherwise determined in advance that the residents were to be absent.

In 151 additional cases, it has been impossible to evaluate the light factor.

"Preliminary findings re-sults indicate that the "Burn a Light in Your Home at Night" campaign will be immensely effective.

"It will help reduce crime, and is making millions of persons more conscious of the need for wider crime prevention activities,' Pitchess said.

The special statistical studies will be continued throughout the campaign and these figures will be released as they are compiled.
