Cycle Pilots to Wind Up Season Sunday at Ascot

It will be "graduation day" Sunday for 20 of the state's leading motorcycle riders.

That's the day J. C. Aganjan holds the final motorcycle steeplechase event of the year at Ascot Park in Gardena, the AMA-sanctioned state championships.

Prize graduates will be young Skip Van Leeuwen of Bellflower and Jimmy Plain of El Sobrante, two of 10 amateur division riders who next year will move into expert competition. Also, 10 novice riders are ticketed for the jump into the amateur class.

Van Leeuwen and Plain will be battling Sunday for the district championship in their division.

All-Time Greats Head Roster for January Pro-Bowl

Iron men of past Pro Bowl football games, all-pro stars who have been perennial standouts in the midwinter classic between the Western and Eastern Conferences of the National Football League, are bidding strong for repeat performances in the 12th annual game Jan. 14 at the Coliseum.

Balloting which followed last week's games showed that such old pros as Chuck Bednarik of the Eagles, Les Richter of the Rams and Yale Lary of the Lions again loom prominently.

Bednarik has played in the traditional all-star series eight times, Richter seven and Lary six.

Names of other Pro Bowl Iron Men have cropped up during the season's nominations. These include Leo Nomellini, the 37-year-old bulwark of the 49ers' defensive line who has appeared in nine Pro Bowl games; defensive end Ernie Stautner of the Steelers, and eight-time selection; Joe Schmidt of the Lions and Bill George of the Bears, two seven-time defensive stars for the West.
