Volunteers contribute their time and effort to some 20 different services at California Hospital, Mrs. Mydland pointed out.

These include assistance in admitting, nursing, clinics, purchasing, the business office, chaplain's office, church relations program, tumor registry, microfilming, medical records, central service, baby photos, host-essing, maternity teas and the gift shop.
