

Torrance Youth Symphony Schedules Yule Concert Sunday at Aviation High School

The Junior Youth Symphony, composed of junior and senior high school students of Torrance and the surrounding communities will present a concert at 4 p.m. Sunday, in the Aviation High School cafeteria, corner of Manhattan Beach Blvd. and Blossom Lane.

Orchestra numbers on the program will include "March Militaire Francaise," "Parade of the Tin Soldiers," "Tambourin Dance," "Sailors Hornpipe," "Hungarian Dance No. 5," "March Slave," and the "Hungarian Comedy" overture. Student soloists will include Ronnie Van Dyck, playing the Mozart Clarinet Concerto, Elbert Deffebach playing the

Trumpeter's Lullaby, and a performance of the Bach double violin concerto played by violinists, Dennis Logan and Sharon Burkhardt. Walter Kennon is accompanist for the student soloists.

A special feature of the concert will be the guest appearance of Victor Sazer, cellist. Sazer is a cello instructor in the south bay area. A former student of the Juilliard School of Music, where he studied with Leonard Rose, he will perform the adagio and allegro from

Corelli's Sonata in D minor and Playera by Granados. He will be accompanied by Sidney Stafford, pianist, who is also a resident and teacher in the South Bay area.

The Junior Symphony of 45 musicians, recently organized by the Torrance Youth Bands, will be conducted by William Hefferman and James Van Dyck. The program is free to the public.

Annual Christmas Display Now Open At El Camino

One of the nation's most unusual Christmas exhibits now fronts the Administration Building of El Camino College, where a series of 12 famed art reproductions are currently on display.

Originated in 1948, Madonna Row features the work of venerated artists who created the original pieces focusing upon the Madonna and Christchild.

Mildred K. Walker, El Camino art instructor, and one of the originators of the campus tradition, remarked that Madonna Row has been a successful attempt on the part of the college to acquire a Christmas project with significance and value.

THROUGH JAN.

Consisting of mosaics, paintings and stained glass, the display of the 8 by 10 foot reproductions will be continued through January 1 in front of the Administration Building at 16007 S. Crenshaw Blvd.

The collection may be viewed at any time by turning on the periphery road fronting the college on Crenshaw.

Miss Walker is coordinating the annual Christmas art presentation with the assistance of Richard L. Olivier and Joseph E. Gadden, also instructors within the art department.

Included among the paintings are Raphael's "The Cowper Madonna" and "Madon-Grunewald's "Virgin and Child with Angel Concert." This view was originally the center panel of an Iseheim Altarpiece and now may be viewed in the Untermyer Museum in Colmar, Germany. The latter is featured on a college Christmas card now on sale in the student store of the college campus.

An El Greco, "The Virgin of Santa Inez and Santa Tecla" was the choice in 1950. The original of the well-known El Greco hangs in the National Gallery in Washington D.C.

Polio Shots Now Required for School Signups

New sections of the Health and Safety Code, passed at the last session of the State Legislature, provide for mandatory poliomyelitis immunization of all school pupils in the State of California. The requirement applies in general to all pupils of any age admitted to public or private primary or secondary schools, including kindergarten, junior college, adult education classes.

Three Salk-type polio immunizations are currently required; however, a pupil may be admitted with one immunization provided the series of three shots is obtained within a period of one year.

For pupils immunized with three injections of polio vaccine prior to January 1, 1962, a signed statement by parents or guardians stating this fact with the approximate dates of immunization will suffice. For pupils immunized with three injections of polio vaccine prior to Jan. 1, 1962, a certificate must be obtained from authorized agency or physician administering vaccine. The certificate must state: (a) Name of immunized person, (b) Birthdate, (c) Date of immunization, (d) Type of vaccine used (Salk or three types of oral), (e) Name of agency or physician administering vaccine. For those persons who may not believe in immunization, a statement stating this fact must be submitted in writing to school authorities and signed by the parent or guardian for all students under the age of 21.

If your child has not yet been immunized against polio, parents must obtain this immunization at the earliest possible time so that the series of three shots may be administered prior to the January 1963 deadline. These immunizations are available through physicians, Los Angeles County Medical Association, polio clinics, any National Foundation Clinic, and at local health centers.

Torrance schools are providing forms for recording of immunization data. For further information contact your local school principal.

NOTICE OF SALE OF BONDS COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 2126-M

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in the matter of County Improvement No. 2126-M (Flat Street) that sealed bids or proposals will be received up to 9:00 a.m., on Tuesday, the 2nd day of January, 1962, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, at its office at 885 Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles 12, California, for the purchase of bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code (Municipal Improvement Act of 1913), and Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code, for the acquisition of rights of way and for the construction of curb, gutter, pavement and drainage structures under the provisions of the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913.

Said bonds shall be issued for all unpaid assessments or portions thereof of which amount to fifty dollars (\$50.00) or over, and shall be in the respective amounts as set forth in the assessment for County Improvement No. 2126-M. Said bonds will be dated the 1st day of December, 1961, and shall bear interest at a rate to be determined at the sale thereof, provided, however, that said rate shall be the same for all bonds, shall not exceed the maximum rate of six per cent (6%) per annum and shall be in multiples of one-fourth (1/4) of one (1) per cent.

Said bonds and the coupons thereof shall be issued substantially in the form authorized for the issuance of bonds under Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California. These bonds shall be serial bonds and shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of January next succeeding the next September 1st following their date, and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable, by coupon, on the second day of January every year after the next September 1st following their date, until the whole is paid, and the interest shall be payable semiannually, by coupon, on the second days of January and July, respectively, of each year following the date of the bonds.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF BONDS TO BE SOLD IS THIRTY-TWO (32) IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FORTY-FOUR THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE DOLLARS AND FIFTY-ONE CENTS (\$44,181.51). Said bonds will be sold for cash only to the bidder whose bid is the opinion of the Board of Supervisors will best serve the interest of owners of land included in the assessment district.

Each bid must state that the bidder offers accrued interest to the date of delivery, and state separately the premium, if any, and the rate of interest offered for the bonds bid for. Each bid shall be for the entire amount of said bonds at a single rate of interest, and any bid for less than the entire amount of said bonds or for varying rates of interest will be rejected. Any bid for less than the maximum rate of six (6) per cent per annum. Payment for and delivery of bonds will be made in the office of the County Treasurer.

A certified or cashier's check for a sum not less than three per cent (3%) of the amount of the bonds, payable to the order of the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors must accompany every bid as a guarantee that the bidder, if successful, will accept and pay for the bonds described in the accepted bid in accordance with the terms of his bid. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall transmit said check to the County Treasurer, and said check shall remain in the possession of the County Treasurer until payment for said bonds has been received. 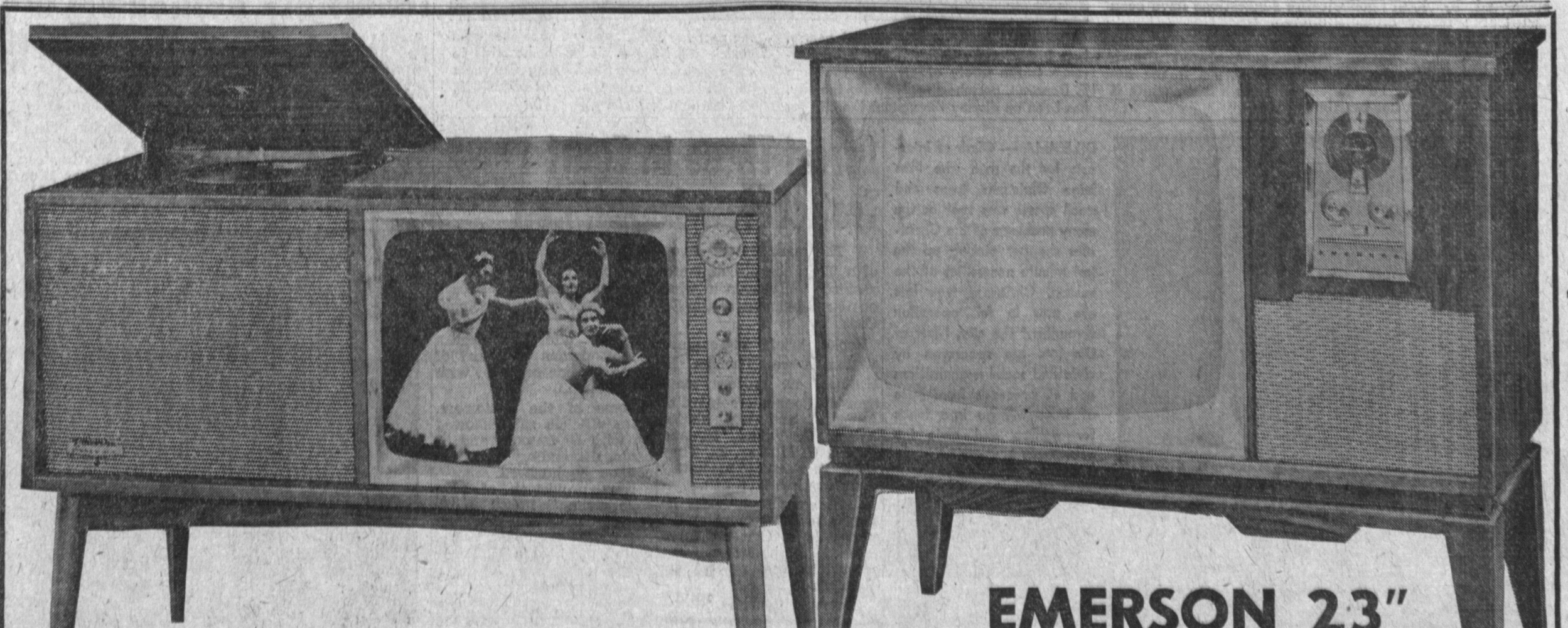
