## **Ryan** Flexible Wing Concept **Under Study**

The Ryan Flex Wing concept is being investigated for possible surveillance drone applications under a contract from the U.S. Marine Corps to the Ryan Aeronautical Company, San Diego, it was announced this week

Two test vehicles constructed by Ryan have been dergoing functional and flight testing at the Marine Corps' desert facility at Twenty-nine Palms.

This is the latest of several orders awarded Ryan by various agencies for different applications and studies of the new flexible wing.

Flight testing and engineering studits of the Flex ing powered test vehicle. designed and built in Ryan's San Diego plant, have been conducted under contract from the U.S. Army Transportation Research Command.

Further wind tunnel- and flight testing of the Ryan Flex Wing test vehicle is currently under way.

Recently, Ryan received another Army TRECOM contract to design Flex Wing unmanned towed gliders which could transport cargo for logistics rekuirements.

The newest contract, from Marine Corps Headquarters, Washington, D.C., will determine the capabilities of a flexible wing drone for sur-Sillance over enemy territory in support of tactical combat operations.




