



Families Join To Construct Lane Scenes

String of lights . . . cotton snow . . . wooden Christmas characters. Such elements, when put in combination on the lawns and homes of Torrance people, result in enticing holiday scenes like the ones on Candy Cane lane on Tucan Street and the display owned by Russell Mayer at 4919 Laurette. •

At Candy Cane Lane, a more than a block long wonderland of snowmen, Santa's reindeer, nativity scenes and snow-clad lawns, the street was made into a one-way lane for the Christmas festivities.

Greeting autos driving down the lane is Santa Claus who passes out suckers and quizzes youngsters about Christmas hopes. Men living on Tucan Street are taking shifts at the Santa Claus post, according to a Candy Cane Lane resident.

INSTIGATOR

The project on Tucan was begun by Chuck Schoendienst five years ago who built a nativity scene. In the years following the initial project Schoendienst created a moving train display, a scene with skaters and a moving snowball display.

This year Schoendienst created a winter waterfall scene with water running down a slope he built on the lawn of his home. "We're just about out of ideas." commented Mrs. Schoendienst as she recalled the scenes built during the past five years.

After using a scene the Schoendiensts passed it on to a new neighbor on Tucan Street with an agreement that the neighbor would create his own display the following Christmas.

'TALKED INTO'

The "regular" neighbors were talked into following the example set by the Schoendiensts and have united to present Candy Cane Lane, according to the homemaker.
