All Must Share the Blame for Tragic Christmas Death

Limited Number of License Renewals to

Be Issued This Month, Says DMV Director

A particularly tragic note marred the merriment of the Christmas season just past—a jarring tone that should make us all pause and give thought to the unfortunates in our community.

At the time of year blessed as the birthday of the Prince of Peace, at a time of feasting and plenty, at the time for present giving and new toys, of joy and the laughter of children. . . . a 4year old Torrance boy died of malnutrition in a local hospital.

The fact that the parents of the boy are alleged to be criminally responsible for the death of the child Christmas morning does not detract from the fact that, in our midst, a baby was allowed to die-of neglect.

Beyond a doubt any one reading of the tragedy would have been glad to help this youngster, would have been happy to cut back on his own Yule comforts in order to make things a little more bright for this unhappy tyke.

And yet, although the parents must accept the responsibility for the child's death, a portion of the blame should rest on all of us for allowing such a situation to exist in our community.

At a time in the history of man when we have shouldered the responsibility of caring for the needy, the weak and oppressed of the rest of the world's teeming millions, to have allowed a small child to die of starvation in our own midst is an unbearable irony.

True, the false pride of the parents who refused to accept charity, the situation which allowed its father to remain out of work for several months, the large family with too many mouths to feed, are all contributing factors.

Yet a portion of the blame and the shame belongs to all of us.


