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## New Type of Racing Set For Western Speedplant

Southern California area automobile racing fans will get their first look at a new type of racing show on Sunday afternoon, Jan. 7, at Gardena's Western Speedway, 139th St. at So. Western Ave.

Called super-modified race cars, they have taken the spotlight in the Mid-West and East, and now the CJA, which sanctions the races at Western, will stage the debut in a nine-event card topped by a 30-lap feature.

The new kind of racing equipment will replace the former hot rod cars that have been in action the last two years. They will feature lighter frame rails, quick-change rear-ends, in-and-out gear boxes, and unlimited size engines of any type. This includes: Corvettes, T-Birds, Cadillacs, Chryslers, Pontiacs, Dodges, Mercurys, Buicks, Lincolns, Oldsmobiles, and De Sotos. Racing begins at 2:30 p.m., preceded by time trials at 1 p.m.

### LEADER

Leading driver entered is "Tiger" Jim Roessler, San Bernardino, 1960-61 CJA hot rod champ, who will gun a Corvette V-8 powered racer owned by Jay Blake, also from San Bernardino.

A trio of top drivers will be his top competition, all three using the popular Corvette engines. They are Chuck Townsen, Gardena, winner of last month's open competition "Race of Champions"; Art Atkinson, South Pasadena, number two man in last year's points; and Billy Wilkerson, El Monte, one of the top drivers in the sportsman cars in San Diego.
