## Skinner Chosen As General Mgr. of Water District

Robert A. Skinner, Assistant Chief Engineer of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California for the past 10 years, has taken over the top administrative position of General Manager and Chief Engineer of the district.

The new water agency chief was selected by the District's Board of Directors to succeed Robert B. Diemer, who retired at the end of 1961 after more than 30 years with the district.

The district, which presently delivers a supplemental water supply from the Colorado River to its 4,000 square mile service area, will also be the major Southern California distributor of water from the north to be made available under the so-called Feather River Project.

Skinner was one of the principal negotiators with representatives of the State Water Resources Department in the formulation of the provisions of a contract between the district and the State for the delivery of northern water to the district.

## Name Chairman of Diabetes Drive

Burrud and his wife have four children, one of whom is a diabetic. "I didn't realize what diabetes could mean to a family until one of my own was diagnosed a diabetic. Then the magnitude of the ailment struck home," said Burrud. "Since then I've done everything in my power to try to help find a cure, so that not only my own child but approximately 5000 others in Southern California may be relieved of the difficulty."

Contributions during the month of January help support the Diabetes Association's program of research, education of the public and a camp program for diabetic children. Given free during the year are tests so that laymen may find out whether or not they are diabetic, since early discovery and treatment is necessary for reasonably normal lives.

Burrud is busy now enrolling workers in radio, TV and newspapers to help raise the funds necessary to carry forward plans for 1962.

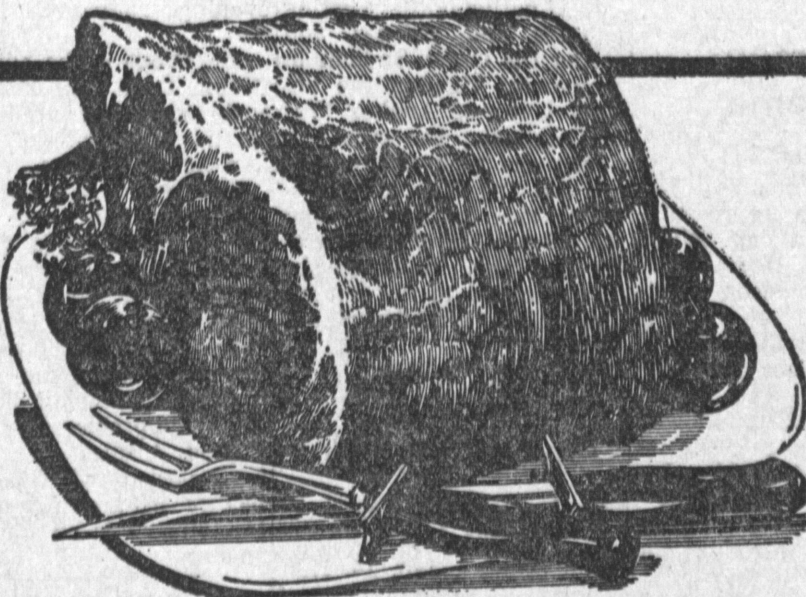
