Local College Students Collect Books for Islands

Harbor College students this week began collecting books and school supplies to be sent to schools in the Philippine Islands.

The collecting campaign is headed by Pat Ngocho, a student from the Philippines now attending Harbor. It was initiated by John Glover, another Harbor student from San Pedro, whose grandmother, Mrs. John W. DeLong, told him about the great need for school supplies after visiting the islands recently.

The books will be transported to Manila on Navy ships. They will go to Oton High School and Santa Barbara High School on Luzon and a school for Igorot natives.

The most needed items are books on the grammar and high school levels, readers, paper, pencils and other school supplies. To meet the shipping deadlines, the students wish to conclude the drive by Jan. 20.

Immigration Head Notes 375,000 Aliens in SoCal

George K. Rosenberg, District Director of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service, recently estimated that 375,000 aliens residing in Southern California will report their address during January 1962 under the Alien Address Re-

port Program. Mr. Rosenberg said that noncitizens are required to file the Special Address Report Card each January. In addition, aliens who are temporarily out of the United States during January must report their address to the Service within 10 days after their return. The District Director said that Address Report Cards will be available at the Immigration Service office at 510 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, California, and also at all local U.S. Post Offices.

Local College Expects Huge Spring Enrollment

With some 8000 students already enrolled for the spring semester, El Camino College anticipates a total registration of 10,500, Leo M. Christian, assistant director of student personnel, announced today.

Prospective students may enroll Tuesday, Jan. 16, and Wednesday, Jan. 18, from 8 to 4 p.m. and from 5:30 to 7 p.m. in the Student Activities building on campus.

To register on these dates, enrollees must obtain reservation cards in the Registration Office.

Registration office hours are from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 8 to 4 p.m. on Fridays.

One late registration day, Monday, Jan. 29, has been planned; no reservation cards will be necessary at that time. Hours for enrollment will be from 1 to 2 p.m. and 5:30 to 7 p.m.

Christian urges all who possibly can to register early as "very few classes will be available at choice times and as the registration period closes students will have difficulty getting classes of their choice."

College ability tests are required for newly enrolling students.

A general college ability test is required of new students who plan to enroll in ten or more units, of part-time students who plan to transfer to a senior college, and of full-time students who transfer on probation from another college.

English placement tests must be taken to enroll in Business 61, English 1A, foreign language, shorthand, stenotype and journalism.

Math tests including algebra and trigonometry are necessary to enroll in intermediate algebra, trigonometry, college algebra analytic geometry and calculus, and elementary statistics.

These tests are not necessary if a satisfactory grade has been earned in a prerequisite college course.

Chemistry placement tests are required to enroll in Chemistry 1A unless the student has completed Chemistry 3 at El Camino College with a grade of C or better.

Chemistry 1A prerequisites, in addition to the test, are completion of high school or at El Camino College.

Persons who have not completed the prerequisites, should not take the placement test, but should enroll in Chemistry 3 or 10, depending upon their major, the college administration advises.

Counseling will be available at registration. Classes for the spring semester will open on Tuesday Jan. 30.

Friday Final Day To Pre-Register At Harbor College

A final reminder that all students planning to attend Harbor College in the spring semester must obtain a registration permit before Friday, was given this week by William McMasters, Assistant Dean of Admissions and Guidance.

Permit, which can be applied for at the Admissions Office, room 151, on the Wilmington campus gives the student a date and time for registration. New day students will be registering on Saturday, Jan. 20, and Friday, Jan. 26. New evening students will register Jan. 23, 24, and 26. All registration is by appointment only.

We have extended the registration period over several days and made it by appointment," said McMasters, "for two purposes: to do away with the long waits and confusion usually associated with registration days, and to give everyone the benefit of advice from a counselor."

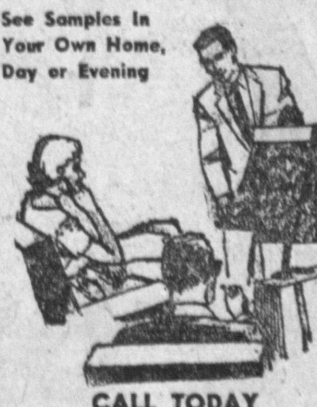
