

Harbor College students this week began collecting books and school supplies to be sent to schools in the Philippine Islands.

The collecting campaign is headed by Pat Ngoho, a student from the Philippines now attending Harbor. It was initiated by John Glover, another Harbor student from San Pedro, whose grandmother, Mrs. John W. DeLong, told him about the great need for school supplies after visiting the islands recently.

The books will be transported to Manila on Navy ships. They will go to Oton High School and Santa Barbara High School on Luzon and a school for Igorot natives.

The most needed items are books on the grammar and high school levels, readers, paper, pencils and other school supplies. To meet the shipping deadlines, the students wish to conclude the drive by Jan. 20.


