Continuing Faith Shown to SoCal By Eastern Co's.

Eastern Life Insurance companies showed continuing faith in Southern California by investing heavily in this area during 1961. Wallace Moir, chairman of the Wallace Moir Company, reported today.

NH Speech Squad Qualifies for April State Finals

Three members of North High's speech squad have qualified to participate in the state-wide tournament to be held in Santa Barbara April 28 and 29, according to Lehr Mushrush, head speech coach at North High School.

Mike Jones, a junior, placed first in Boys' Impromptu; senior Karen Jackson took second in Girls' Impromptu; and junior Bud Baumgarten placed second in Boys' Extemporaneous at the USC tournament.

Ten members of the North speech squad were among the 620 entries from the 71 schools that participated. Four of the 57 speakers in final rounds came from North High and three of the 20 qualifying for state are from North.

Sandy Rayes, a senior, placed third in Girls' Extemporaneous but did not qualify for state. Other squad members who attended the tournament were Maureen Bereskin, Claudia Wilkins, Bronwen Crowell, Jerry Lemberger, Judy Morgan and Peter Gregora.

Sixty per cent of the squad made semi-finals and 30 per cent of the squad qualifying for state.

Ships Carry Clothing to Far East for Needy

Five Long Beach-based minesweepers of Pacific Mine Force Division 92 deployed recently to the Western Pacific for a six-month tour of duty with the Seventh Fleet.

The ships sailed from Pier 9, Long Beach Naval Station Jan. 2 for a first stop at Pearl Harbor, then Midway Island, Guam and Subic Bay, Philippines. There the division, commanded by Commander John D. Tull, 708 Balboa Drive, Seal Beach, California, will meet Mine Division 73, now on duty in the Far East.

The minesweepers carried on board more than two tons of clothing, collected by Los Angeles County Girl Scouts, for delivery to less fortunate in the Far East.

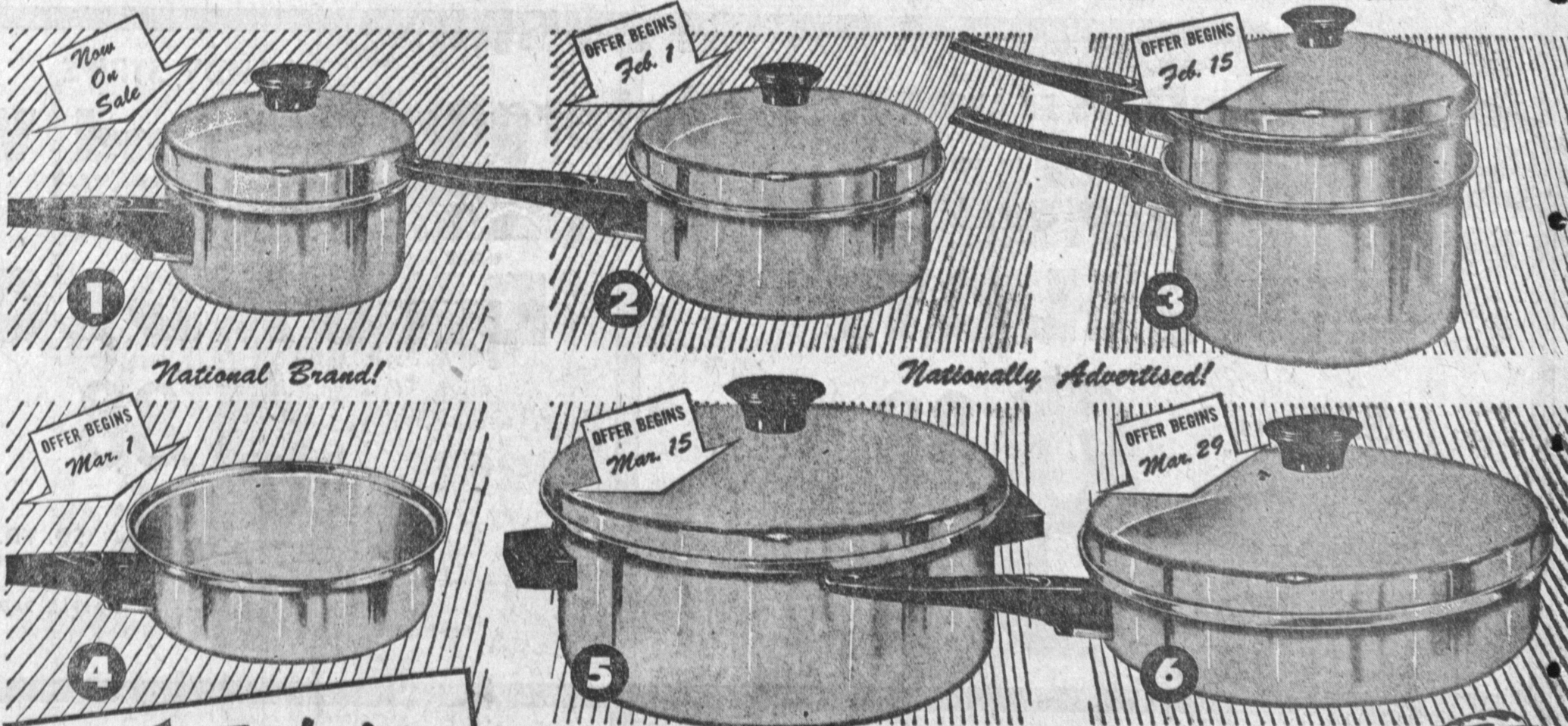
At least one division of Pacific Mine Force ships is constantly on duty in the Far East, helping to insure the United States' continued command of the seas and serving as a good will example to our allies.
