Officials of the Pacific Coast Little League this week announced that a general meeting for players and parents will be held Wednesday, 7:30 p.m., in the South High School cafeteria.

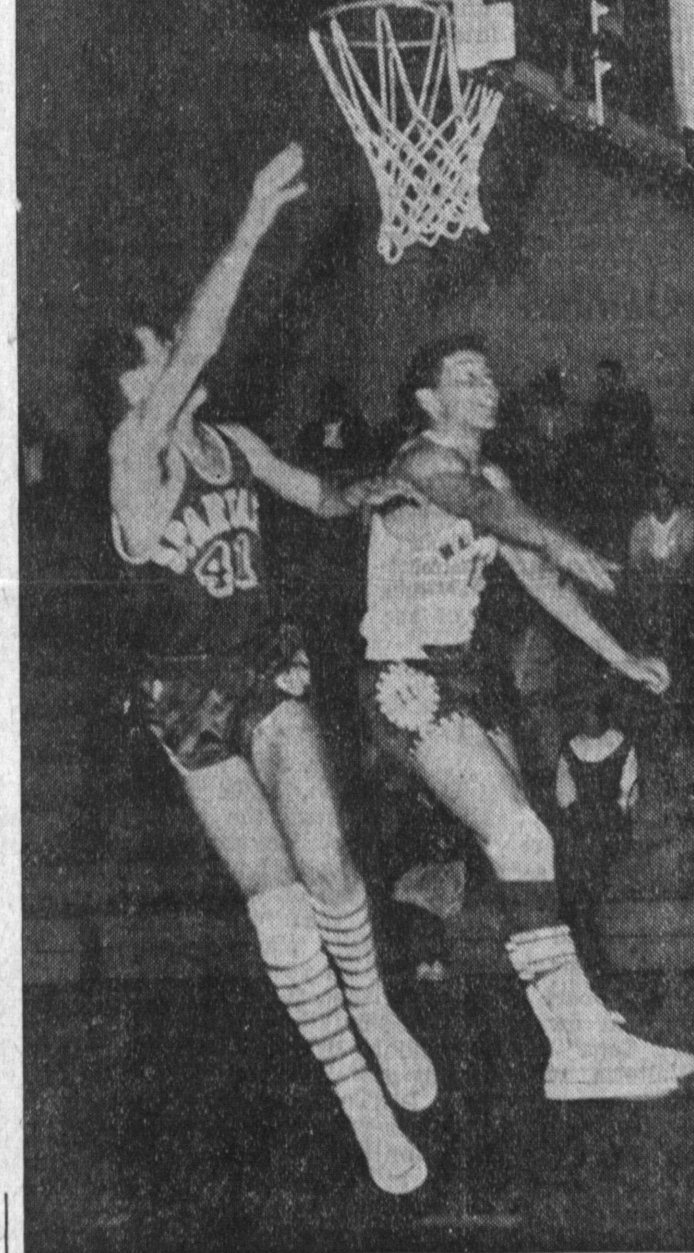
Speakers at the meeting will be Merrill Combs and Bert Shepherd.
