County Will Pay \$5600 for Carson Street Projects

Board of Supervisors last week allocated \$5,600 for a roadway improvement project in the Carson area.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said about 7,000 square feet of pavement will be constructed to join with the newly constructed curb and gutter on Milton St. east of Budlong Ave. and on the north side of Milton St. east of Raymond Ave. In addition, cross-flow gutters will be constructed across Milton St. at Berendo Ave. and at Raymond Ave.

Project will be scheduled by the Los Angeles County Road Department pending the completion of other portions of the current work load.

"The improvements will facilitate area drainage and lower roadway maintenance costs," Supervisor Chace said.

He also noted that this type of project is a phase of work performed by the County Road Department in cooperation with property owners who construct curb and gutter under county permit to add to the operational efficiency of county roadways.

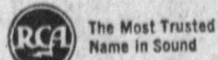
