Navy School Quotas Are Available

Navy class A school quotas are available for 44 percent of those enlisting in February of this year; it was announced by Chief Piech, the local navy recruiter. High school graduates may qualify through local testing and enlist assured of a school program in their chosen field. Non-High school graduates may enlist as seaman recruits and vie for school assignment through test batteries administered by the Naval Training Station at San Diego. School programs available include: Nuclear, Electronics, Polaris, Aviation, Electrical, Machinery and Hospital.

Men electing not to participate in school programs will be assigned duty in the ships of the fleet after 9 weeks of basic training at the Naval Training Center in San Diego.

Dr. John Popper to Appear at Meeting of University Women

Torrance music lovers, as well as all interested persons in the Peninsula and South Bay area, are invited to hear Dr. Jan Popper, who will speak on "Music, the International Language" at the general meeting of the Palos Verdes-Rolling Hills branch of the American Association of University Women to be held on Feb. 15 in the auditorium of the Malaga Cove School, 385 Via Almar, Palos Verdes Estates.

Dr. Popper will illustrate his speech by playing excerpts from the world's great music on the piano. His background in the field of music includes being a concert pianist, symphonic and operatic conductor in his native Czechoslovakia; establishment of an Opera Workshop at Stanford University; an educator and lecturer associated with UCLA; guest conductor of the LA chamber symphony and a television series entitled "Spotlight on Opera."

SPCA Divides Time Between Dogs and Cats

A total of 73,594 animals—consisting for the most part of dogs and cats—were handled by the Los Angeles SPCA and Southern California Humane Society during the calendar year 1961, according to a report by George Crosier, general manager of the society. This includes adoptions, homeless animals which were sheltered, unwanted pets picked up, etc.

During the past year, 325 animals—dogs, cats, birds, and several types of wild life—were also rescued by the society from various precarious situations. In the main, says Crosier, dogs are inclined to be trapped in ditches or drainpipes; cats generally require rescuing from tall trees into which they have climbed for safety, but from which they are afraid to descend.

INVESTIGATIONS Zoos, stables, poultry operations, slaughter and action houses, and pet shops were the subjects for the SPCA's 1,548 investigations during the year 1961. These affected a total of 166,763 animals.

Additional activity during '61 included animal protection and rescue work during the Hollywood, Bel-Air, Brentwood, Topanga, and Kagel Canyon fires, at which time Crosier and his officers assisted a large but unrecorded number of pets and wild creatures.

In carrying out its duties last year, the society's vehicles traveled 243,537 miles, Crosier concluded.


