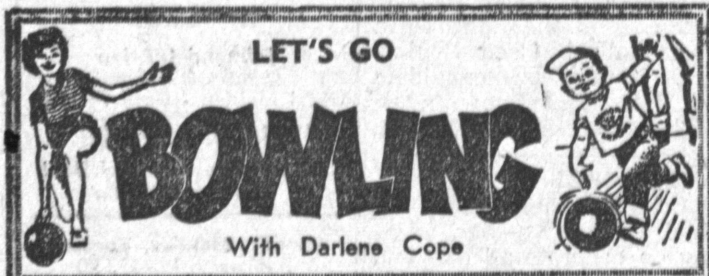

Former Warrior Shortstop Signed for \$28,000

Another feather was stuck in the El Camino College's baseball cap this week when the Kansas City A's announced the signing of EC shortstop, Herb Newman for a reported \$28,000.

Newman, a native of New Jersey, arrived at El Camino following a four-year stay with the U.S. Navy in Honolulu.

During his term of service in the newest state, Newman was named to the All-Service baseball team.

USS coach Rod Dedeaux, who first discovered the navy star, termed his ability as "fantastic."

Newman's contract with the American League team calls for the \$28,000 bonus plus full tuition to the college of his choice during the off-season.

FARM TEAMS
Following spring training at Daytona Beach, Newman is expected to be assigned to one of KC's class A farm teams.

Other feathers in the EC cap to date include Joe Moeller, Dave Marsden, Mike Andrews, Dundee Jones and Bob Guy.

Although Moeller, Dodger hill ace, never played officially with the men from Warriorville, he did attend EC in the fall. Therein lies the Warrior claim.

Moeller, along with brother Gary, was signed after he graduated from Mira Costa.

He first drew a Dodger berth in California's C League.

In one year he skipped up the ladder and ended the season with triple A Spokane.

While Moeller fought for his varsity berth, he racked up a phenomenal first-year record of 20-9.

Although Moeller has voiced his preference for one last year of seasoning in the Dodger farm system, Manager Walt Alston has indicated that the young fireballer will start the '62 season as a key Dodger hill corpsman.

CATCHER
Dave Marsden, EC's front line catcher in last year's campaign inked his okay with the L.A. Angels last summer.

Last year he compiled a .354 batting average for the season.

In his senior year at Torrance's North High, he joined the elite of high school baseball as an all-CIF catcher.

Marsden isn't quite sure where he'll play ball in '62. The Angels have him tentatively scheduled to backstop for San Jose of the California League.

El Camino freshman Mike Andrews signed his agreement early in the fall with the Boston Red Sox.

Red Scout Joe Stevenson approached Andrews with a bonus offer after watching the EC youngster playing American Legion ball.

Andrews was named All-Metro and All-American during the football season and was named All-Bay League during his senior year at Torrance's South High.

Former Mira Costa flash, Dundee Jones became the property of the Washington Senators just before the Metropolitan Conference opener last spring.

Bob Guy played most of the season with the Warriors before the New York Yankees staged a talent raid on the EC campus and ran off with the hard-hitting outfielder from Hawthorne.

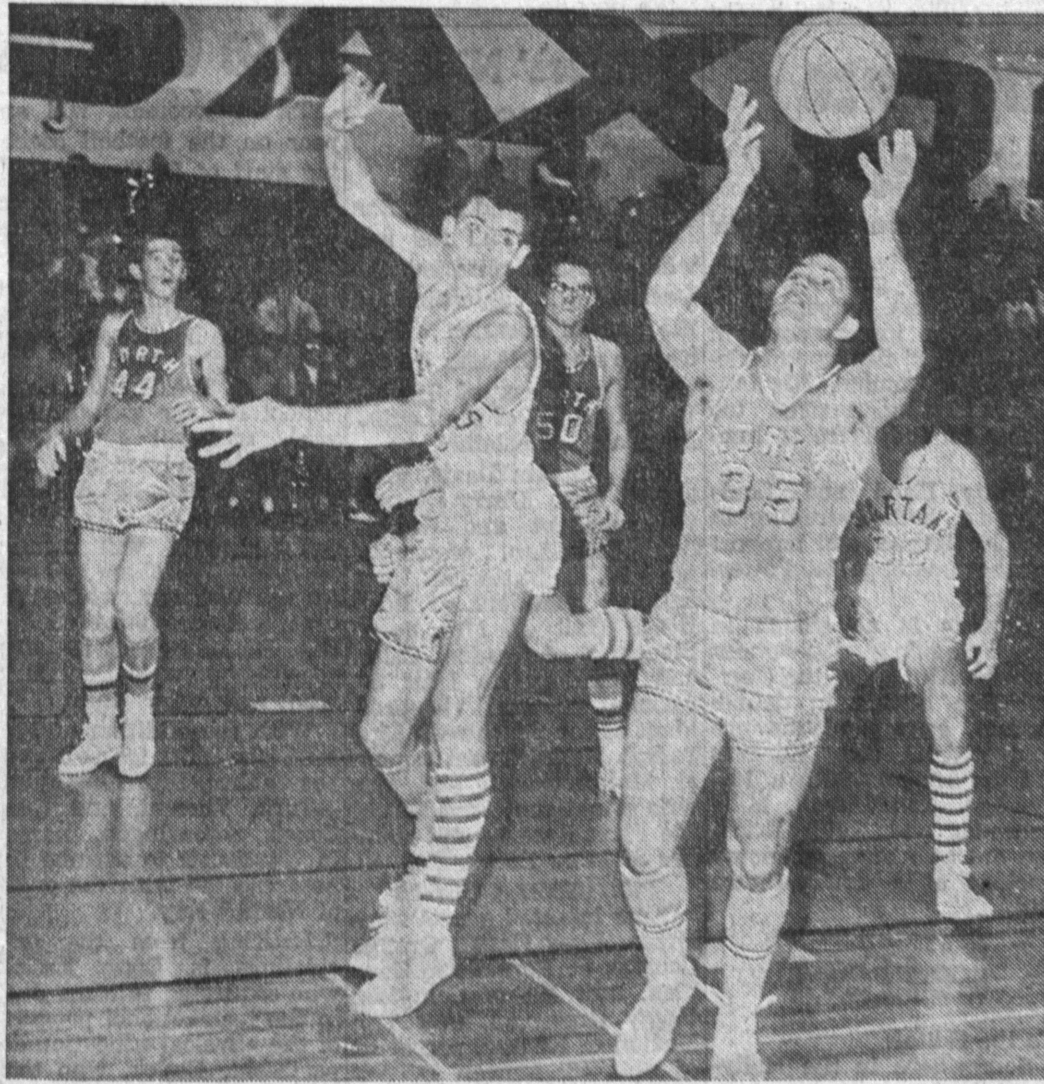
